Dear Parishioners,

Jesus is preparing his disciples for the time when he will no longer be physically present among them. He promises that the Father will send them the Holy Spirit, ‘another Advocate’, to be with them for ever. ‘Advocate’ is a legal term. An advocate is one who pleads our cause in court, who speaks on our behalf, who utters the words that we cannot, who stands beside us in very difficult situations.

As we give thanks for the Holy Spirit who is our Advocate, we recognise that we in turn are called to be advocates for those people in our community, who cannot speak for themselves. There are many organisations, often inspired by the Gospels, that are involved in advocacy—for refugees, for women and children being trafficked, for the mentally ill, the unborn and the aged who are unable to plead their own cause. And as St Peter reminds us in today’s second reading, we are also called to be advocates for Christ by having an answer ready for people who ask us the reason for the hope we have. Let us remember that it is always the witness of our lives and our own personal stories, rather than complex theological doctrines, that attract people to Christ.

Laudato Si' Week – 16th-24th May 2020

Catholic Earth Care Australia and its partners at Parramatta Diocese, the Australian Province of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and Campion Centre of Ignatian Spirituality are inviting us to celebrate Laudato Si' Week by listening, praying, reflecting and participating in Pope Francis' call for a week-long celebration to commemorate the fifth anniversary of the encyclical.

Special religious education (SRE) has been temporarily paused until schools are back to normal so the CCD team has been busy developing *Learning from Home* lessons. The lessons cover all stages of learning from Kinder to Year 12.

CATECHISTS

While catechists are not going into schools during the pandemic, they have been praying for the students and their families during their normal class times. Many catechists are also taking the opportunity to keep their training requirements up to date by undertaking the online training courses which CCD offer. Additionally, the CCD team will be offering Zoom Safeguarding training for all SRE catechists during the month of June.

CCD has been working closely with the Department of Education to ensure that online SRE learning is made available through schools. The Department and SRE Providers are also working closely to ensure a smooth return

The Word

Sunday 17 May 2020: Sixth Sunday of Easter

First Reading

From the Acts of the Apostles Acts 8:5-8. 14-17

They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town. When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.
