Dear Parishioners

There are very few recorded instances in history of one person being both a king and a priest.

Today's first reading tells of one such person, the mysterious Melchizedek, King of Salem, who fulfilled a priestly role by blessing Abraham. David and Solomon, two kings of Israel, also performed some priestly functions.

Another person who is both priest and king if Jesus Christ. As king, Christ is the lawgiver and protector. His law is contained in the Sermon on the Mount (see Matthew, chapters 5-7) and summed up in his command, 'love one another as I have loved you' (John 13:34). As priest, Christ offers his life on the cross, reconciling all creation to God.

Through baptism we participate in Christ's priestly and kingly role. We share in the kingship of Christ by serving one another, protecting the most vulnerable among us and giving our wise counsel. We share in Christ's priestly role when we take part in worship, interceding on behalf of humanity and mediating the life and blessings of God to our world. We are both priests and kings when we fulfil the instruction of Jesus in today's Gospel: 'give them something to eat yourselves'. We draw strength from the Eucharist to be Christ's presence and action in the world. We will honour the Eucharist by a procession after the 10am mass.

APPEAL FOR TIBETAN REFUGEES

Our appeal to assist Tibetan refugees will be held next weekend which also marks the beginning of Refugee Week. The theme of Refugee Week in 2022 is "healing."

With the opening of Australia's international borders, the Social Justice Group is currently assisting a much larger number of newly arrived refugees in comparison to previous years. Many of these new arrivals require support in accessing prescription medication, hearing aids and other heath aids.

Due to COVID-19 the Social Justice Group is unable to hold our annual raffle which is usually our main fundraiser for the Tibetan refugees. However, a donation box will be available after each Mass next weekend. Please consider making a donation to assist the refugees receive the assistance they need.

We will also be holding the annual appeal for blankets, doonas and doona covers next weekend. All donations are welcome and will make a big difference to the refugees who, due to the increasing cost of electricity, are unable to afford heaters, electric blankets etc. It would be appreciated if you could ensure the blankets and doonas are provided in a bag to assist with transport. Blankets and doonas are required for both children and adults.

The Word Sunday 19 June 2022, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

First Reading

From the book of Genesis Gen 14:18-20

Melchizedek brought bread and wine.

Melchizedek king of Salem brought bread and wine; he was a priest of God Most High. He pronounced this blessing: 'Blessed be Abraham by God Most High, creator of heaven and earth, and blessed be God Most High for handing over

your enemies to you.' And Abraham gave him a tithe of everything. The Word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 109:1-4. R. v.4

(*R*.) You are a priest for ever, in the line of Melchizedek.

- 1. The Lord's revelation to my Master: 'Sit on my right: I will put your foes beneath your feet.' (*R.*)
- 2. The Lord will send from Zion your sceptre of power: rule in the midst of all your foes. *(R.)*
- 3. A prince from the day of your birth on the holy mountains; from the womb before the daybreak I begot you. (*R.*)
- 4. The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change. 'You are a priest for ever, a priest like Melchizedek of old.' (*R.*)

Second Reading

From the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 1 Cor 11:23-26

Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming the death of the Lord. This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming to his death.

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 9:11-17

They all ate and were filled.

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing. It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets. The Gospel of the Lord.
