"Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners,

The setting for the Annunciation to Mary appears to be a domestic setting. The angel came to her, in her home, in the midst of her ordinary daily life. This is so different to the

setting for the angel's appearance to Zechariah, in the parallel annunciation scene in the first chapter of Luke. Zechariah is in the Holy of Holies the most sacred part of the temple. Being a woman, Mary had no access to the Holy of Holies. So it seems to have been in an ordinary domestic setting that this marvellous intervention of God into Mary's life occurred. We can say in effect that in the first annunciation story Zechariah went to God, but in the second story God comes to Mary.

We can also note the contrast between Jerusalem, with its magnificent temple where the Lord appeared to Zechariah, and Nazareth where the angel appeared to Mary. Can anything good come out of Nazareth?, people asked. It was a backwater, that held no claims to fame or prestige or religious significance.

At times we may have a profound experience of God in a chapel or church, but God can and will visit us also in the ordinary settings of our life, in our homes, our work places, while travelling, and so on. Wherever and however God may speak to us, let us pray that we, like Mary, may be able to give our 'fiat', our yes. May we be able to say with Mary: 'I am the servant of the Lord; let what you have said be done to me'.

Bishop Anthony calls us to return to the Eucharist. An Excerpt from the letter to the People in the Diocese of Broken Bay

"In my Decree of 18 March 2020, in response to the crisis of the pandemic, I dispensed the Faithful of the Diocese of Broken Bay from the ordinary obligation to be present at the Sunday Eucharist. Now, with the welcome situation that has developed, with gratitude to God, I rescind that Decree, and call upon and encourage the Faithful to resume their obligations as part of the living Body of Christ. Under Canon 1247, the Faithful are now once more obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and the Holy Days of Christmas and the Assumption. Notwithstanding, those who are aged or have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risk of COVID 19 are free to remain at home, honouring the Lord's Day through the best way open to them. Some examples are participating in the live-streamed Mass, private prayer, reading the Scripture, praying the Rosary."

The Word Sunday 20 December 2020: Fourth Sunday of Advent

First Reading

From the second book of Samuel 2 Sm 7:1-5. 8-12. 14. 16

The kingdom of David will be established for ever in the sight of the Lord.

Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent'. Nathan said to the king, 'Go and do all that is in your mind, for the Lord is with you.'

But that very night the word of the Lord came to Nathan:

'Go and tell my servant David, "Thus the Lord speaks: Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, to be leader of my people Israel; I have been with you on all your expeditions; I have cut off all your enemies before you. I will give you fame as great as the fame of the greatest on earth. I will provide a place for my people Israel; I will plant them there and they shall dwell in that place and never be disturbed again; nor shall the wicked continue to oppress them as they did, in the days when I appointed judges over my people Israel; I will give them rest from all their enemies. The Lord will make you great; the Lord will make you a House. And when your days are ended and you are laid to rest with your ancestors, I will preserve the offspring of your body after you and make his sovereignty secure. I will be a father to him and he a son to me. Your House and your sovereignty will always stand secure before me and your throne be established for ever."

You will conceive and bear a son.

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you' the angel answered 'and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too: your kinswoman Elizabeth has, in her old age, herself conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible to God.'
