SOCIAL JUSTICE CORNER:

Rwanda Raffle and Handicrafts

Please support our fundraising on June 19-20 for the Franciscan Sisters in Rwanda.

COVID-19 has severely limited the activities of the Franciscan Sisters at their project for youth with disability in Muganza, but the work of the Sisters has been integral in educating and protecting their local community. Contact tracing, random testing, lockdowns and restrictions in Rwanda have successfully limited transmission and deaths in this vulnerable but highly resilient nation. The Sisters can therefore plan with hope for their future activities.

Corpus Christi Social Justice Group and parishioners have supported the Rwandan Sisters since the first fundraising concert held in 2012 which led to the opening of a new Centre for youth with disability in 2014. Since then, raffles, donations and handicraft sales



have helped to develop farming and other activities contributing to the Centre's self-sustainability. One ongoing issue, however, has been the lack of appropriate kitchen facilities at the Centre, which would enable the Sisters to sustainably expand their activities, provide training, receive volunteers, and raise further funds. The raffle to be held after Masses this weekend to raise the last few thousand dollars needed to build a new kitchen outbuilding at their Centre in Muganza, Southern Province, Rwanda.

Raffle tickets will be \$5 each, handicrafts are great value for a gift with extra special significance.

The Word Sunday 20 June 2021: 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

First Reading

From the book of Job 38:1. 8-11

Here I have set the boundaries of the sea. From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said: Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, when I wrapped it in a robe of mist

and made black clouds its swaddling bands; when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast with a bolted gate? Come thus far, I said, and no farther: here your proud waves shall break. The Word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 106:23-26. 28-31. R. v.1

(R.) Give thanks to the Lord, his love is everlasting.

- 1. Some sailed to the sea in ships to trade on the mighty waters. These men have seen the Lord's deeds, the wonders he does in the deep. (*R*.)
- 2. For he spoke; he summoned the gale, tossing the waves of the sea up to heaven and back into the deep; their soul melted away in their distress. (*R.*)
- 3. Then they cried to the Lord in their need and he rescued them from their distress. He stilled the storm to a whisper: all the waves of the sea were hushed. (*R*.)
- 4. They rejoiced because of the calm and he led them to the haven they desired. Let them thank the Lord for his love, the wonders he does for men. (*R*.)

Second Reading

From the letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 2 Cor 5:14-17

All things are made new.

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here. The Word of the Lord.

From the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 4:35-41 Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.' The Gospel of the Lord
