"I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is Good Shepherd Sunday. John introduces the image of the shepherd by describing how the shepherd enters the sheepfold, calls the sheep by name, and leads the flock to pasture. Then Jesus identifies himself as the good shepherd who lays down his life for the sheep. The text mentions the suspicion often levelled at shepherds by acknowledging that those who came before Jesus were indeed 'thieves and robbers' (John 10:8). The image is transformed completely when the title 'good shepherd' is applies to Jesus. The context makes clear that Jesus is not claiming expertise in animal husbandry; rather, it suggests that he is claiming a special relationship with the flock. Responsible leaders, like good shepherds, were expected to seek the welfare of the flock and even risk their lives for the flock, and like Jesus, the good shepherd, modern martyrs today lay down their lives for Christ and the good of the Church.

People today, most of whom see shepherds only in movies or on television, and nonetheless moved by the comforting image of a shepherd. in times of difficulty or intense sorrow, they derive comfort from praying Psalm 23: "The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want" (v. 1). Moreover, the image of Jesus as Good Shepherd challenges religious leaders to be 'shepherds after God's own heart' and inspires the people, the 'flock', to turn to him for love and security.


The presentation of candidates will be held at the weekend masses on the 25th and 26th May.

Anzac Day Reflection

"Anzac Day is an important day of remembrance and reflection for many, paying tribute to the people who fought and gave their lives during World War I... Sadly, the contribution of Indigenous soldiers in this battle and the many other battles and wars that followed is often forgotten and overlooked. Military service and war have been a significant part of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history.

For First Nations people, the war provided an opportunity to escape the poor working conditions, racial prejudice and



control they experienced in Australia on their own lands. Indigenous people displayed a warrior spirit protecting their Country, and joining the forces also gave them a chance to earn a wage.

Once Indigenous people returned home to civilian life after WWI and WWII, devastatingly, nothing had changed; their service was not acknowledged or celebrated; they returned to discrimination and prejudice. Many found they were rejected from hotels and public places or denied employment and the benefits offered to other returning service personnel.

It is only in recent years that Aboriginal and Torres Strait service people have begun to be formally recognised for their service to our Country. So, on Anzac Day, as we all take a moment to reflect, let's pay our respects to the thousands of brave Indigenous service people who gave everything to protect Australia."

Collect

Almighty ever-living God, lead us to a share in the joys of heaven, so that the humble flock may reach where the brave Shepherd has gone before. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit. God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

From the Acts of the Apostles Acts 4:8-12

This is the only name by which we can be saved.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence, today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.'

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to John Jn 10:11-18

The good shepherd lays down his life for his sheep.

Jesus said:

'I am the good shepherd:

the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.

The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep.
