

(Gospel)

Dear Parishioners,

A powerful scene at the beginning of Jesus' Passion is the Agony in the Garden, recorded in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. John's Gospel does not record the Agony in the Garden. However, biblical scholars

describe today's Gospel as the 'agony' scene in John. Jesus tells two of his disciples that his soul is troubled, and that he is ready to cry out to the Father, 'save me from this hour!'

In John's account, some Greeks who want to see Jesus arrive at the very moment he is experiencing his agony. And I believe that in some way these Greeks are the answer to Jesus' prayer to be saved from the anguish of his hour. Jesus cannot dwell on what awaits him; their cry reminds him that there are people who need him, who need his saving love. The whole purpose of his being lifted on the cross is to draw all people to himself—all people, Jews and Greeks alike.

When we feel that our own troubles are getting too great, we can share our feelings with others as Jesus did. Like Jesus we can also cry out, 'Father, save me from this hour!' Our good God will save us, probably not by solving our problems, but by helping us to hear the cries of others who need us, the cries of those who are less fortunate than we are. Remarkably, responding to their needs will bring healing peace to our life as well.

On **Friday 19 March**, **2021**, Pope Francis will launch the year "Amoris Laetitia Family" which will conclude on **26 June**, **2022**, on the occasion of the X World Meeting of Families in Rome. Celebrating five years since the publication of the apostolic exhortation Amoris Laetitia, the Pope is calling for the upcoming year to be dedicated to giving thanks once more for the beauty and joy of love in the family, and to spend time reflecting on the themes of the apostolic exhortation. Each month the Holy Father will issue a video explaining a chapter of Amoris Laetitia together with people sharing their everyday experiences of family life. The Pope has suggested ways the church can accompany families this year by developing 12 concrete pastoral proposals he has called "Walking with Families". International Women's Day Special: Hani Abdile in conversation with Hava Rezaie

The Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS) Australia has extended an invitation to listen to Hani Abdile in conversation with Hava Rezaie, both remarkable women who have spent their lives challenging injustice.

Hava Rezaie is a Hazara community leader, women's rights advocate, and Advisory Committee Member of the JRS Australia's Finding Safety project. Hava is a mentor to many migrant and refugee women in vulnerable situations across Sydney, and collaborates with JRS, Sydney Alliance, SSI and other civil society organisations for systemic reforms to refugee and domestic/family violence policy.

Hani Abdile is an accomplished spoken-word poet, journalist-in-training, and a Refugee Advice and Casework Service (RACS) Ambassador. This is the first of a number of conversations Hani is holding with community leaders in 2021.

In this conversation, Hani and Hava discuss:

- Hava's vocation as a women's rights advocate in Afghanistan and Australia
- The impacts of COVID-19 on women experiencing sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV) in Australia
- The challenges that women on temporary visas experiencing violence face
- The vital support that organisations such as Jesuit Refugee Service and the Refugee Advice and Casework (RACS) provide
- Hava's dreams and aims for the future.

PARISH FINANCE UPDATE SIX MONTHS TO 31 DECEMBER 2020

Dear Parishioners

THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY IN TIME, TALENT AND TREASURE

Over the first six months of the financial year your parish has managed to achieve a surplus of income over expenses, primarily due to the boost we received from the Government. It is apparent from our financial statement that collections are holding up and we are most grateful for your generosity, particularly as we have not been able to pass the plate around for the first and second collections. The Tap & Go facility that was installed over this period has proved successful and is slowly replacing the loose second collection. Thank you to the parishioner who donated two of the Tap & Go machines.

Our Alpha and Discipleship programmes are well supported and are virtually self-funding. We have shown the income and expenditure from these programmes separately in our financial statement.

As we no longer qualify for Government assistance the Jobkeeper and stimulus incentives have ceased.

We encourage parishioners who haven't yet joined the planned giving to participate by way of a direct debit or credit card. If you haven't yet but would like to contribute by direct debit or credit card please either call the Parish Office (9144 6998) or complete the attached **form** and return it to the office or drop it in the second collection bag at the front of the church

Expenses are generally in line with past periods. However, our repairs and maintenance are increasing as the parish office, which is now quite old, requires additional maintenance. Over the last six months the carpets in the main areas of the parish office were replaced. We will need to spend more money on the parish office over the next year.

Parishioners will know that it is the intention of the Diocese to sell Murphy House. We are in discussions with the Diocese as to what this means for our Carmelite community and what arrangements need to be made to find accommodation for our parish priests.

The amount owing on the roof loan at 31 December 2019 was \$30,014 and we continue to make our normal monthly repayments as shown in our financial statement.

We thank all parishioners for their continued support as we all work together during these difficult times to enhance our Parish.

Sunday 21 March 2021: Fifth Sunday of Lent

First Reading

From the prophet Jeremiah Jer 31:31-34

The days are coming when I will make a new covenant with Israel and I will forgive their iniquity. See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks - when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive - it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest - it is the Lord who speaks - since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind. The Word of the Lord.

it remains only a single grain;

but if it dies,

it yields a rich harvest.

Anyone who loves his life loses it;

If a man serves me, he must follow me,

wherever I am, my servant will be there too.

If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him.

Now my soul is troubled.

What shall I say:

But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour.

Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.

'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown.

And when I am lifted up from the earth,

I shall draw all men to myself.'

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.
