Then, taking the five loaves and the two fish he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before them (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

It was probably only about twenty years after the Last Supper that Paul, writing to correct some errors in the Corinthian community, gives us a precious gem of our tradition, namely the earliest account of what Jesus said and did at that final meal with his disciples. It reminds us always of the heart and core of what we do when we celebrate the Eucharist, and the very foundation and reason for subsequent devotional practices such as those associated with today's feast. We must never forget those words: "Do this as a memorial of me" and their implications for our Christian life. It makes present the Christian Passover of the passion, death and resurrection in a sacramental way. This is the fundamental parable of hope. Without it there would be no salvation. All experiences of life can be related to these three holy days.

Likewise, the setting for the story of the feeding of the crowds in each of the Gospels is important. Jesus' care for the physical needs of the people who follow him is a response to the deep feeling he has about their spiritual hunger. The narrative, so familiar to us, has obvious similarities with the words we hear in the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Jesus' dialogue and instructions to his disciples are equally significant. Like them, we are called to feed the hungry, both with bodily nourishment and the Word of Life. In other words, as we celebrate this great gift today, may we ourselves be bread for others.



WHY WE DO The Things We Do Feast of Body and Blood of Christ

Today's feast (*Corpus Christi* in the Latin) focuses on the Eucharist as a symbol and sacrament of unity. Although we celebrate the Eucharist every Sunday, today we pause to give special consideration to the Bread of Life nourishing our lives. When we break bread and share the one cup we recall that sacred meal between Christ and his disciples just before he sacrificed his life on the cross. We know that, like those disciples, Christ's death and resurrection has bonded us in a love relationship. For this reason, the Eucharist is never a private affair but always a call to unity. As you receive communion today, be conscious not only of Christ's presence in the Eucharistic host, but his presence in those who are receiving with

The Word

Sunday 22 June 2025: The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Collect

O God, who in this wonderful Sacrament have left us a memorial of your Passion, grant us, we pray, so to revere the sacred mysteries of your Body and Blood that we may always experience in ourselves the fruits of your redemption.

Who live and reign with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

From the book of Genesis Gen 14:18-20

Melchizedek brought bread and wine.
Melchizedek king of Salem brought bread and wine; he was a priest of God Most High. He pronounced this blessing: 'Blessed be Abraham by God Most High, creator of heaven and earth, and blessed be God Most High for handing over your enemies to you.' And Abraham gave him a tithe of everything.

The Word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 109:1-4. R. v.4 (R.) You are a priest for ever, in the line of Melchizedek.

- 1. The Lord's revelation to my Master: 'Sit on my right: I will put your foes beneath your feet.' (R.)
- The Lord will send from Zion your sceptre of power: rule in the midst of all your foes. (R.)
- 3. A prince from the day of your birth on the holy mountains; from the womb before the daybreak I begot you. (R.)
- 4. The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change. 'You are a priest for ever, a priest like Melchizedek of old.' (R.)

Second Reading

From the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 1 Cor 11:23-26

Every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming the death of the Lord. This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming to his death. The Word of the Lord.

Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the living bread from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live for ever. Alleluia!

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 9:11-17

They all ate and were filled.

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing. It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets. The Gospel of the Lord.
