

Dear Parishioners,

I wonder how the women in Jesus' time felt. It was a patriarchal society but Jesus challenged that view. The apostles, council representatives and elders of the church were all men. Men were officially chosen as the twelve apostles and sent out as the messengers and bearers of the Good News.

And yet, we know women were present in the life of Jesus. His mother, Mary; Mary Magdalene, who ran from the tomb having encountered the risen Christ; the woman at the well and the woman who was saved from being stoned to death. Women, too, knew and loved Jesus and were bearers of Jesus' love in the world, to be messengers of hope, and bearers of mercy.

Whether we are called to live as Religious, married, single, or in particular profession, we are all mandated by that 'letter' of the Council of Jerusalem to announce the Good News and to live the joy of our resurrected Christ.



Uluru Statement from the Heart


Over the past several years, the Social Justice Group has been briefing our Parish community on the Uluru Statement from the Heart. The Statement was released 5 years ago, 229 years since European settlement. It followed extensive consultation across Australia with 1,200 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander delegates, representing over 800,000 indigenous people. The Statement is an invitation for all Australians to walk with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people for a better future.

The Statement proposed structural reforms to address the challenges experienced by First Nations People including the establishment of a First Nations Voice to Parliament. A Voice to Parliament, enshrined in the Constitution, would enable Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to give real and practical advice to Parliament and the Government on how laws and policies can best improve the lives of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Implementation of the Voice to Parliament can only come via a referendum organised by the Federal Government. A successful referendum would be a unifying moment in Australian history.

The Social Justice Group supports the Statement and considers it an important acknowledgement of Australia's First People inhabiting this land for more than 65,000 years. With the federal election this weekend, it is timely for our Parish to update our knowledge about the Statement, whether new to us or not, to inform our views. The Word Sunday 22 May 2022, Sixth Sunday of Easter

First Reading

From the Acts of the Apostles Acts 15:1-2. 22-29

It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and ourselves not to burden you beyond what is essential.

Some men came down from Judaea and taught the brothers, 'Unless you have yourselves circumcised in the tradition of Moses you cannot be saved.' This led to disagreement, and after Paul and Barnabas had had a long argument with these men it was arranged that Paul and Barnabas and others of the church should go up to Jerusalem and discuss the problem with the apostles and elders. Then the apostles and elders decided to choose delegates to send to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas; the whole church concurred with this. They chose Judas known as Barsabbas and Silas, both leading men in the brotherhood, and gave them this letter to take with them: 'The apostles and elders, your brothers, send greetings to the brothers of pagan birth in Antioch, Syria and Cilicia. We hear that some of our members have disturbed you with their demands and have unsettled your minds. They acted without any authority from us, and so we have decided unanimously to elect delegates and to send them to you with Barnabas and Paul, men we highly respect who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accordingly we are sending you Judas and Silas, who will confirm by word of mouth what we have written in this letter. It has been decided by the Holy Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials: you are to abstain from food sacrificed to idols, from blood, from the meat of strangled animals and from fornication. Avoid these, and you will do what is right. Farewell.'

Second Reading

From the book of the Apocalypse Rv 21:10-14, 22-23

He showed me the holy city coming down out of heaven.

In the spirit, the angel took me to the top of an enormous high mountain and showed me Jerusalem, the holy city, coming down from God out of heaven. It had all the radiant glory of God and glittered like some precious jewel of crystal-clear diamond. The walls of it were of a great height, and had twelve gates; at each of the twelve gates there was an angel, and over the gates were written the names of the twelve tribes of Israel; on the east there were three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. The city walls stood on twelve foundation stones, each one of which bore the name of one of the twelve apostles of the Lamb. I saw that there was no temple in the city since the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb were themselves the temple, and the city did not need the sun or the moon for light, since it was lit by the radiant glory of God and the Lamb was a lighted torch for it.

And my word is not my own: it is the word of the one who sent me. I have said these things to you while still with you; but the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all I have said to you. Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me say: I am going away, and shall return. If you loved me you would have been glad to know that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I. I have told you this now before it happens, so that when it does happen you may believe.' The Gospel of the Lord.
