

Dear Parishioners,

When Jesus commends or criticises people in this Sunday's Gospel parable, it is on the basis of actions of mercy done or not done in the simplest of circumstances. Both groups of people

didn't recognise Jesus in the needy people but one group acted compassionately towards them. The other group just ignored them.

We could be tempted to think that the first group were naturally kind as they didn't realise what they were doing. Not so, life isn't that easy and God's salvation isn't that unfair. No, those actions seemingly done almost spontaneously, without thought or salvation, only come after some time practising virtue. We discipline ourselves to follow Christ, taking up our cross, consciously being kind, sacrificing our preferences for the sake of others so that, in the end, loving kindness comes so naturally that we don't even realise what we are doing. Having consciously practised the steps of kindness and thoughtfulness, we can then spontaneously dance the mystery of love.

Ignite Your Parish Program

As you will no doubt have noticed, we have been promoting the upcoming Advent Program by Ignite Your Parish and music by the Vigil Project that will begin this Advent on 28/29 November 2020 (Sunday week). What a crazy year we have endured and this is the perfect antidote.

We are very excited to be running this in our parish this year. I have already watched some of the material and it is relevant, engaging and exciting. It is a 5 week program, including Christmas week. This is about taking our faith deeper - it doesn't matter where you are in your faith journey. This is for everyone!

The purpose is to explain the program a little more and gather a team of people to help with the distribution of this program on 28/29 November 2020. You will need to be there 20-30 mins before Mass and something similar after. So basically, if you attend a particular Mass on the Weekend, could you help at that Mass? The program is centred around the Gospel readings for each week of Advent and Christmas and can be done individually, with a few others in your own homes, or in small groups either in the parish hall or on Zoom. **NB:**There is an added advantage of doing this in a small group, that you will not get individually, because are extra added group questions for discussions. We highly recommend attending a small group. Research shows, that when people share, it can result in a deeper experience for themselves as well as others in the group.

If you would like to host a small group in your own home, please let me know so I know who is partaking in the journey and so I can direct a few people to you if you would be happy to have others join you. Please make contact with me as you will need to be part of the training next Wednesday, 25 November 2020 to understand how it will work in a group setting. Alternatively, if you would prefer to join a home group rather than in the parish or on Zoom, please let me know so I can link you.

RED WEDNESDAY 2020

Red Wednesday is a day to gather and draw attention to the plight of those who are persecuted and oppressed for their religious beliefs. Cathedrals, churches and public buildings around the world will light up in red to show solidarity with our brothers and sisters in Christ. Red Wednesday is an initiative of Aid to the Church in Need (ACN), a Catholic charity dedicated to the support of suffering and persecuted Christians. In Australia, Red Wednesday will take place on the 25th November.

It is clear that the persecution of Christians is worse today than at any time in history. In terms of the number of people involved, the gravity of the acts committed, and their impact. The purpose of Red Wednesday is to join together and raise a strong voice in support of the persecuted who are unable to speak freely, and who look to us - their brothers and sisters in Christ - to speak on their behalf.

Sunday 22 November 2020: Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

First Reading

A reading from prophet Ezekiel Ez 34:11-12. 15-17

You, my flock, I judge between sheep and sheep. The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest — it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them.

As for you, my sheep, the Lord says this: I will judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and hequats.

Second Reading

A reading from first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 1 Cor 15:20-26. 28

He will hand over the kingdom to God the Father, so that God may be all in all.

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all. The Word of the Lord.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Matthew Mt 25:31-46

He will take his seat on his throne of glory, and he will separate men one from another.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.
