(Gospel)

Dear Parishioners,

When I was a child, I remember seeing a tree in our garden, being slowly overtaken by a parasitic plant. The plant looked beautiful and luscious, almost like a tree

itself, but over time it started to choke the tree. Removing it was a big operation. In our Gospel today, Jesus uses similar imagery to reflect on the situation of the world and the reality of living a life of faith. Darnel and wheat look very similar until the ear appears. While the servants in the reading are ready to remove the darnel, the owner is wary they may pull out the wheat as well, and so instructs them to let them grow together.

Our society is full of wheat and weeds – beautiful acts and experiences of faith and love, and challenging, painful experiences of resentment, violence, and hurt. We realize that both coexist in our world with consequences for all.

In each individual's life there are wheat and weeds. It is appropriate to praise God for the wheat he has fostered as one has cooperated with his grace but also to acknowledge the weeds asking God under and with his grace over time to reduce the weeds with ones cooperation turning them into wheat. This is living our faith promises we solemnly made at our baptism, when we first received the spirit.

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn."
