Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each of them. (First Reading)

#### Dear Parishioners,

On the Jewish celebration of Pentecost which recalls God's establishment of a covenant with the people of Israel, the gift of the Spirit, 'the power from on high' (Luke 24:49) opens a new relationship with God and humankind. Signs associated with the event at Sinai

are recalled: thunder; lightning, and fire (See Exodus 19: 16-20). The one nation, Israel, is transcended as peoples from many nations understand the disciples who are 'filled with the Holy Spirit', as they speak 'about the marvels of God'.

In the second reading Paul lists the contrasting characteristics of a life without the gift of the Spirit and a life 'guided by the Spirit'. We must examine those characteristics and hear Paul's exhortation: 'Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit'.

The Gospel reading selects two passages from Jesus' farewell discourse to his disciples. As he returns to the Father, the Spirit/Advocate will continue the presence of the divine among us. Filled with the Spirit, we will continue Jesus' mission of being witnesses to God. However, Jesus has not been able to communicate all the truths of God and God's design for us in the brief history of his ministry. He still has much to teach us. But that will be done down through the Christian ages in and through the presence of the Spirit/Advocate who has learnt from the Father, and 'will tell us of the things to come'.

#### NEW TRESTLE TABLES READY FOR USE IN THE PARISH HALL.



The new Parish Hall trestle tables (20) have now been delivered and are now available for use in the Hall. These tables weigh approximately 13kgs and come with a handle for carrying if required. These new tables replace the current heavier (up to 32kgs) tables.

Not only has the sale of old tables provided more valuable funds (amount to be confirmed when complete), it has also saved us the cost of disposal (which, as you would appreciate, could be substantial). It is envisaged the funds raised for the sale will go towards the needs of the Parish Hall.

#### **First Reading**

From the Acts of the Apostles Acts 2:1-11

### They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome -Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

From the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 1 Cor 12:3-7, 12-13

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

From the holy Gospel according to John Jn 20:19-23

### As the Father sent me, so I send you: Receive the Holy Spirit.

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.' The Gospel of the Lord.
