I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers! (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

One of the most important and deep-seated questions humans ask is, "Will I be saved!' This is expressed in other ways, like *'Is heaven real? How*

will I enter it?' In fact, almost all religions speak of offering salvation.

Who will be saved? Through a parabolic teaching, Jesus, in today's Gospel, warns those who think that entry into the kingdom is through 'ascription', that is, the assignment of status through kinship ties. The Jews may be the chosen people, children of Abraham, but their salvation is far from assured. Jesus' parable of the Narrow Door emphasises that entry into the kingdom is based not on ascription but on performance. The authentic response to Jesus' teaching entails both hearing and doing. The true disciple is one who hears the word of God and puts it into practice, bearing the fruit of repentance and good deeds.

To the question of whether only a few will be saved, Jesus pictures a multitude "from east and west, from the north and the south" reclining at the banquet in God's kingdom. Luke refers to the ingathering of the Jews from the diaspora in the eschatological times (Isaiah 43:5; Zechariah 8:7) and adds the ingathering of the Gentiles to stress the theme of universalism. The coming of the Gentiles is not a rejection of the Jews. But Jesus disabuses the Jews, especially their religious leaders, of the idea that they can rely on their status as children of the kingdom. Salvation is God's gift freely given to the Israelites, and now to the Gentiles. The Jews should welcome the kingdom with gratitude and humility, and not as something due them because of their ties with Abraham.

This coming week, the Carmelite community will be attending a clergy retreat on the 25th and 26th of August. There will only be communion services on those days.

Sydney's Peace Picnic

You are warmly invited to Sydney's Peace Picnic on Sunday, 31 August 2025, from 12 p.m. to 2 p.m. at Wentworth Common, Sydney Olympic Park.

The picnic is an interfaith, cross-cultural, and intergenerational event celebrating solidarity and unity. It is intended to be more than one day in a park; it is about reconnecting Sydney's spirit and compassion through music, dialogue, breaking bread, and shared purpose. The event is being supported by The Justice and Peace Office, Archdiocese of Sydney, Caritas Australia, St. Vincent de Paul, Catholic Mission, United Nations Association of Australia and other agencies.

What do I bring?

Bring enough food for your party and to share, as well as water and sunscreen (there is tap water on the site). There is no place nearby to purchase food.



What's expected of me?

Nothing more than a willingness to meet new people! There will be a few activities to help break the ice; other than that, just sit back and enjoy some tunes, yarns, and the great outdoors. Participants are invited to come dressed in a way that speaks peace, whether it's your cultural dress, a tribute to your peace hero, or simply something blue!

How should I get there?

Parking at Sydney Olympic Park is scarce on weekends, and there are only a small number of spaces adjacent to Wentworth Common. It is recommended that you take public transport and walk from Olympic Park Station to Wentworth Common (a 17-minute walk).

If walking this distance is a challenge, your best option is to arrange to be dropped off while your vehicle driver goes to find parking elsewhere in the precinct.

What if it rains?





We have good news and bad news!

The Bad News: Unfortunately we were declined for the government grant we applied for as there were 3500 applications and there must have been more needy causes (many, many church grants don't get granted).

The Good News: However, we had started fundraising to upgrade the parish sound system before we found out about the grant opportunity and because of all the hard work from many volunteers and all your generosity, we are able to implement the first phase of the upgrade when we've reached our phase 1 target.

PHASE 1 OF THE UPGRADE: will include a new audio control, iPad, microphones and a permanent setup.

This will have the biggest impact on the improvement in the system and its effectiveness. It will also save the choirs and other stakeholders almost an hour of set up for each Mass.

To date, we have fundraised \$17,200 with the cake sale, movie night, raffle and Praise and Worship event.


Our events have been dual purpose to raise funds but also and very importantly - to create parish community. Come and join in and meet other parishioners as we grow closer to God and each other.

CORPUS CHRISTI PARISH REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2025

Dear Parishioners

We are grateful for the wonderful support of our parishioners, many of whom work behind the scenes to assist with the day to day running of the parish. We are also grateful to our office staff who work hard to provide the support services needed to keep the parish going. We also thank our parishioners who continue to support our Parish financially.

Our operating deficit for the year was similar to the previous year (\$59,900 compared to \$60,887). On the positive side, due to parishioner generosity we had no shortfall this year in meeting our Pastoral Works Fund quota. This compares to a \$16,115 shortfall the previous year. However, our income declined by about 6% to \$216,938 and we had higher than normal Office Expenses due to necessary computer and photocopier/printer replacements. Additionally, Employment Expenses increased by approximately \$9,000 due to extra hours worked by Admin staff during the movement of the Office function to its new location.

During the year works across several projects completed. These works included the refurbishment of the Parish Presbytery, refurbishment of the Parish hall to accommodate a temporary office set-up and mould remediation in the Parish hall. This enabled the Carmelite priests to move out of their rental accommodation and back onto the parish grounds in December 2024. After a few months of minor completion works and settling in, the Presbytery and Office areas, as well as the remaining Parish Hall space is functioning well. We greatly appreciate the spirit of cooperation showed by the Admin staff in ensuring this transition went smoothly.

The total amount expended in completing this project work was \$620,583. Of this \$613,611 (almost 99%) was raised through the generosity of donations by parishioners and a co-contribution from the Broken Bay Diocese. This was a magnificent expression of parish community spirit and we are very grateful to parishioners. So for a total spend of \$620,583 (including rent of \$45,000), we now have a long-term presbytery, a functional office space with a board room and a satisfactory hall for which we may be proud. So, thank you. We are happy with the quality of the work completed by the builder Excelsis. Excelsis worked with Mr Greg Malouf, who headed the Building subcommittee. Greg put in countless hours in steering the project from the commencement stage, coordinating with the builder on project management aspects through to final satisfactory completion. We thank all involved over the months of planning and we are grateful to parishioners who provided valuable and meaningful feedback along the way.

Consideration of this feedback and further reflection meant that previous and significantly more expensive options were re-evaluated. We believe that the final building works completed provide suitable office amenity, parish hall facility and accommodation for the Parish Priests. Given the ongoing reporting deficit, we have suspended further fundraising activity associated with new building works at this time.

The project shortfall increased our annual deficit to \$66,871. The Finance Committee is investigating ways to address this ongoing deficit situation. Without a significant increase in revenue or reduction in expenses, all the parish cash funds will be exhausted within a few years.

Our parish continues to follow its mission of seeking to "Evangelise, celebrate our faith, foster community and serve God and each other." Our goal is Missionary Discipleship. We are moving from a maintenance church to a missionary one in keeping with Jesus' great commission: "Go make disciples of all nations, baptise them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and teach them to obey all I have commanded you" (Mt 28).

Our mission depends on our parishioners' support and we thank you for your contributions over the last twelve months.

Children's Sacramental programme

The Children's Sacramental Programme is a three-stage process that is delivered over a twelve month period. The first sacrament in this programme is Confirmation, followed by Reconciliation and is completed with First Holy Communion, when the children become fully initiated into the Church.

Our thanks go to Gerri Hadwen, our Sacramental Co-Ordinator, for the wonderful work she does in working with the families to prepare the children for the sacraments.

Over the year we had the following numbers of children through the programme: 41 for Confirmation, 38 for first Reconciliation and 39 for first Eucharist. The children came from both our local Corpus Christi Parish School and the state schools in our area.

Catechists

Our catechists, led by Jennifer Perrot, put a lot of work into preparing lessons, activities of significance and attending professional development opportunities. Our catechists bring the Word of God to children in state schools in our area and assist in preparing those children to receive the Sacraments. We are still looking for catechists and would welcome further volunteers for this very important ministry. Please contact Jen Perrott at the parish office on 9144 6998 if you can assist.





Second Reading

From the letter to the Hebrews Heb 12:5-7, 11-13

The Lord disciplines those he loves. Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training;

God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.
