Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

St Paul reminds his readers of the magnificent patrimony connecting them with Exodus story: 'how our fathers were all guided by a cloud above and how they all passed through the sea.' Centuries later, in a 1974 statement on preaching, the Vatican would echo this Pauline text, urging that these Old Testament stories be taken to heart personally: 'Our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea' (CRRJ, *Notes*, 11.2). Christian baptism draws us into the great story of salvation told over both Testaments. Dying and rising with Christ, we are 'reborn' into the life of God and God's people! The Gospel parable of the fig tree warns us not to take this gift for granted. With God's gifts comes responsibilities. Despite many struggles, it was Jewish fidelity to the Covenant that brought forth the Christ. Despite our many failures as a Church, we Christians labour to bring forth the fullness of God's kingdom. Continuing our journey through Lent, let us give thanks for our ancestors in faith as we enter personally into the epic stories of both Testaments. And let us pray for all Christians and Jews today in their respective sacred covenantal obligations.

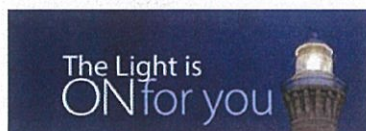

Parish Pastoral Council Update

Dear fellow Parishioners of Corpus Christi Catholic Parish, it is with great pleasure I bring to you a summary of progress on behalf of your Parish Pastoral Council.

For those of you who do not know me, I am Linda Taneja, Chairperson of your Parish Pastoral Council (PPC).

Your current PPC Council was established on the 1st July 2018. We have placed photos of your parish council members in the church foyer to facilitate your contact.

The purpose of your PPC is to advise and support the Parish Priest on Pastoral matters and ministry at a strategic level. Three key areas currently being focused on include;

- The Plenary Council – Invitation for people to have their say about what they believe God is asking of us in Australia – responses recorded and considered for the future of our Church in Australia
- Development of Youth Ministry within our Parish – To provide opportunity for Youth who are an integral part of our Parish renewal, growth and success
- Grow as Missionary Disciples – providing opportunity for us to enrich our lives and the lives of others as we grow in relationship with Jesus

We are blessed to have around 200 of our Parishioners in various Ministries, Committees and services such as Readers, Eucharistic Ministers, Altar Service, Music, Catechists, Social Justice, Administration / Finance, Hospitality and many more, together with those who minister and serve the wider community in hidden and unofficial ways. Our sincere thanks and appreciation to all, as we strive forward in our mission to become disciples of Jesus forming a warm welcoming and invitational Parish.

Jesus calls us to love and be one with the Lord.

Bring forth the goodness of heart and rejoice in the love we share. As one with the love of the Lord, is blessed and will yearn to share the goodness with others.

To assist us on the journey and help achieve our goals and build community, we will be running Alpha within our Parish commencing Tuesday, 14th May, 2019. More information and registration for this exciting opportunity will be shared over the coming weeks.

Your PPC have been and are involved in various focused workshops provided by specialists from the Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay together with related activities including meeting with others from parishes who have achieved significant renewal within community.

PPC outcomes so far include:

- Appointment of Faith Formation Facilitator, Jen Perrott – to help strengthen our ministries and activities within our Parish.
- Introduction of Name badges to encourage Parishioners to get to know each other by name. If you would like one, put your name on the list in the foyer. It will be provided for you to wear with pride.

- Thanked and farewelled Barbara Yee, Principal of Corpus Christi Primary for her valuable input and attendance at the PPC and welcomed Jayne Wheen, newly appointed Principal of Corpus Christi Primary as we strive forward to strengthen our focus on Youth.
- Youth – Brainstorming meetings with Youth within our Parish, Youth Cross, Youth Masses, Meeting with Youth Specialists from the Diocese of BB and beyond to assist with planning for Youth within our Parish.
- Many Listening and Dialogue sessions carried out within our Parish in response to the Plenary Council Topic ‘What is God Asking of us in Australia today?’ Responses were recorded and submitted to the Plenary Council for consideration within the study – major themes which have emerged within our Parish and across Australia include;
 - A greater voice on social justice issues
 - A greater role for women
 - Importance of prayer and the sacraments
 - Rebuilding community and trust within the Church
 - Married Priests? Women Priests?
 - Greater Church presence in the media
- Extensive planning and preparation to facilitate ALPHA at Corpus Christi Parish - Currently running an ALPHA pilot to train and prepare for our Parish Sessions
- Facebook page set up “Corpus Christi Catholic Church”

Your PPC meets monthly and will be reporting to the Parish periodically.

We invite you to talk to anyone of your PPC Members, Fr Greg, Fr Johnny or the Parish Office about your thoughts or suggestions. In addition, a suggestion box has been placed in our Church foyer.

In addition, I would like to share a statement on behalf of your PPC which was tabled at our March meeting.

In light of the toll and despair many Catholics are experiencing from recent events surrounding our faith, we expect that the pressure on all of our Parish Priests will be understandably immense and offer them our full support and prayers at this time.

We the lay members of the Parish Council declare our total support for our Parish Priest, Fr Greg and the Priests of our Carmelite Community. We acknowledge their piety, knowledge, dedication and service. We thank them for devoting their lives and continually nurturing our faith as we stand shoulder to shoulder with them in resisting the present adversity.

Sunday 24 March 2019: Third Sunday Lent - (Corpus Christi) - Year C

First Reading

From the book of Exodus Ex 3:1-8. 13-15

This is what you must say to the children of Israel: I Am has sent me to you.

Moses was looking after the flock of Jethro, his father-in-law, priest of Midian. He led his flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in the shape of a flame of fire, coming from the middle of a bush. Moses looked; there was the bush blazing but it was not being burnt up. 'I must go and look at this strange sight,' Moses said, 'and see why the bush is not burnt.' Now the Lord saw him go forward to look, and God called to him from the middle of the bush. 'Moses, Moses!' he said. 'Here I am' he answered. 'Come no nearer' he said. 'Take off your shoes, for the place on which you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your father,' he said 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.' At this Moses covered his face, afraid to look at God. And the Lord said, 'I have seen the miserable state of my people in Egypt. I have heard their appeal to be free of their slave-drivers. Yes, I am well aware of their sufferings. I mean to deliver them out of the hands of the Egyptians and bring them up out of that land to a land rich and broad, a land where milk and honey flow.' Then Moses said to God, 'I am to go, then, to the sons of Israel and say to them, "The God of your fathers has sent me to you." But if they ask me what his name is, what am I to tell them?' And God said to Moses, 'I Am who I Am. This' he added 'is what you must say to the sons of Israel: "The Lord, the God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you." This is my name for all time; by this name I shall be invoked for all generations to come.' The Word of the Lord.

Second Reading

From the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians 1 Cor 10:1-6, 10-12

All this that happened to the people of Moses in the desert was written for our benefit.

I want to remind you how our fathers were all guided by a cloud above them and how they all passed through the sea. They were all baptised into Moses in this cloud and in this sea; all ate the same spiritual food and all drank the same spiritual drink, since they all drank from the spiritual rock that followed them as they went, and that rock was Christ. In spite of this, most of them failed to please God and their corpses littered the desert. These things all happened as warnings for us, not to have the wicked lusts for forbidden things that they had. You must never complain: some of them did, and they were killed by the Destroyer. All this happened to them as a warning and it was written down to be a lesson for us who are living at the end of the age. The man who thinks he is safe must be careful that he does not fall.

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 13:1-9

Unless you repent you will all perish as they did.

Some people arrived and told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with that of their sacrifices. At this he said to them, 'Do you suppose these Galileans who suffered like that were greater sinners than any other Galileans? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen on whom the tower at Siloam fell and killed them? Do you suppose that they were more guilty than all the other people living in Jerusalem? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did.' He told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard, and he came looking for fruit on it but found none. He said to the man who looked after the vineyard, "Look here, for three years now I have been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and finding none. Cut it down: why should it be taking up the ground?" "Sir," the man replied "leave it one more year and give me time to dig round it and manure it: it may bear fruit next year; if not, then you can cut it down."
