"And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white" (<u>Gospel</u>)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The observation of the English mystic poet William Blake that 'great things happen when men and mountains meet' is true of such pivotal events in the Hebrew and Christian Scriptures as Moses' reception of the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai and the transfiguration of Jesus 'on a high mountain'.

In the latter instance, as recorded by all three synoptic writers and now included in the luminous mysteries of the rosary by St John Paul II, Jesus is revealed as a long-awaited Messiah. Accompanied by representatives of the Law and the Prophets (Moses and Elijah), he is transfigured in the presence of Peter, James and John. His human bodiliness becomes the vehicle through which his inner reality as God-Man shines forth. Surely, this was a source of hope to his disciples after Jesus' prediction of his death by crucifixion became a reality. Alluding to this event Peter wrote: 'We had been eyewitnesses of his majesty...while we were with him on the holy mountain' (2 Peter 1:16-18).



Social Justice Corner



The Most Dangerous Place in the World to be a Child Childhood and adolescence should be a time of hope, not horror. Sadly, that is not the case for many children around the globe, including in Ukraine and Gaza. As the horror of the current conflict emerges, UNICEF Global Spokesperson James Elder has called the Gaza Strip *the most dangerous place in the world to be a child.*

In Gaza, 47.3% of the population is under 18. Reports from humanitarian agencies indicate the current conflict is the deadliest conflict for children in modern times:

- A Palestinian child is killed every 15 minutes. There are now at least 19,000 orphans in Gaza and thousands who have lost one parent. Soaring rates of malnutrition and diarrhea, combined with insufficiently safe water, food and sanitation, could see child fatalities resulting from disease eclipse those related to the bombardments (UNICEF)
- At least 11,500 children have been killed, with thousands more missing under rubble (Ministry of Health, Gaza). More than 10 children a day are losing one or both legs.

Those having limbs amputated are having it done without anaesthetic (Save the Children).

Save the Children's Jason Lee has said: It's beyond belief that the world is allowing this to continue. The impact of seeing children in that much pain and not having the equipment or medicines to treat them or alleviate pain is too much, even for experienced professionals. Even in a war zone, the sights and sounds of a young child mutilated by a bomb cannot be reconciled, let alone understood, within the bounds of humanity.

James Elder reported: In my twenty years with UNICEF, travelling from one humanitarian crisis to the next – from famines to floods and war zones to refugee camps – I've simply never seen such devastation and despair as is

FINANCE UPDATE – SIX MONTHS TO 31 DECEMBER 2023

THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY IN TIME, TALENT AND TREASURE

Dear Parishioners

Over the last six months we have been concentrating on the planning for the new presbytery and making sure the assets of the Parish remain in good working order.

We thank those parishioners who were able to attend the two briefing sessions that were held in December and thank you for your feedback and comments. We also thank those parishioners who are assisting us with the planning of the new project. There were several suggestions made and we are busy incorporating the changes that will make the project less expensive and hopefully enable us to complete the project more efficiently. We intend having further parishioner briefings over the next couple of months.

Our fundraising is going well and we thank those parishioners who have helped us raise just on \$250,000 to date. The Diocese will contribute 50 cents for each dollar we raise up to a maximum of \$250,000 and we thank the Diocese for this generous donation. We are still asking parishioners to let us know if they have any contacts in the building and construction industries who may be able to provide labour and/or materials at reduced rates to assist us in making the presbytery one to be proud of.

It is pleasing to note that our operating income is up by 20% over the same period last year and our operating expenses are 5% lower than the corresponding period last year. We are still running at a slight deficit and are doing what we can to reduce our expenditure.

Over the six months to December we installed a TV in the boardroom at the back of the hall. This is proving useful to the groups that utilise this boardroom. We also renewed the Hall for Hire banner and the income from hall hire is increasing. A very successful concert and raffle was held in November that raised just over \$21,000 and we thank all those who organised the event.

We welcome all new parishioners and encourage those who haven't yet joined the planned giving to participate by way of a direct debit or credit card. If you haven't yet but would like to contribute by direct debit or credit card please call the Parish Office (9144 6998) or complete the form that can be found at the back of the Church and return it to the office or drop it in the second collection bag at the front of the church.

We thank all parishioners for their continued support as we all work together during these challenging times to enhance our Parish.

Bio of a Catechist Les Leong

Who Am I?

I retired in 2012 from formal employment as an executive of a major international corporate group, headquartered in South Africa. By far, the larger part of my working life was with a corporation, responsible for financial resources, functions, risks and reporting. It is normal for management teams in corporations to have a key responsibility of driving up profitability and ultimately the value of the business. This is the environment that I worked in for over 37 years.

Family

My wife, Teresa, and I immigrated to Australia from South Africa in 2015 as we wanted to be a part of the 'growing up' phases of our two Australian grandchildren. We have a son, who with his wife and two sons immigrated to Bangkok, Thailand from London, UK in December 2023. Our daughter lives in St Ives with her husband, and son and daughter. We share the home with them.

How long have you been a catechist?

I have been a Catechist for only 1 year so far, and I can report that I have not missed a class because it is self-satisfying and I reckon satisfying for the children. This year my wife and I will be travelling abroad so both of us will miss Catechism classes for a number of months. Although there is a dire shortage of Catechists, we are pleased that the current team have rallied to cover the lessons for us.

What brought you to being a catechist?

My life in South Africa was naturally dominated by asset accumulation and providing for the future. Teresa was for a large part of her life involved in religious development and teaching at a Catholic College in South Africa. Currently she has served a Catechist for about 7 years. I attended a Bible study course offered to the St Ives Parish, called "The Big Picture." This course exposed me to Christian salvation history, and the promise of our Creator to his children that there is an opportunity after our earthly existence. After this course, I experienced a paradigm shift in my life. I discerned that I needed a counterbalance to previous priorities, and that was a stronger belief and faith in Scripture teachings. Thus I deemed it important to allocate a fair portion of time to courses, resulting in me completing Alpha, Metanoia, and attending Bible Chapter studies by Father Sunny, etc. I also decided that one of my personal development needs is to teach young children scripture, necessary wisdom that I missed in my youth. Consequently, my initiative to become a Catechist

Why do you stay?

My only 1 year of teaching convinces me that there is a need for this ministry.

What would you say to someone considering being a catechist?

It is normal for each of us to learn how to cope with our life's journey in this earthly world.

Scripture gives us as Christians a view of what is to come during and after this life journey, and you may see that there is an essential need to inform children of this as a Catechist.

- 2. Your servant, Lord, your servant am I; you have loosened my bonds. A thanksgiving sacrifice I make: I will call on the Lord's name. (*R.*)
- 3. My vows to the Lord I will fulfil before all his people, in the courts of the house of the Lord, in your midst, O Jerusalem. (*R*.)

Second Reading

From the first letter of St Paul to the Romans Rom 8:31-34

God did not spare his own Son.

With God on our side who can be against us? Since God did not spare his own Son, but gave him up to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that he will not refuse anything he can give. Could anyone accuse those that God has chosen? When God acquits, could anyone condemn? Could Christ Jesus? No! He not only died for us – he rose from the dead, and there at God's right hand he stands and pleads for us.

From the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 9:2-10

This is my Son, the beloved; listen to him. Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here: so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
