# The prayer of the humble will penetrate the heavens (First Reading)

Dear parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Who are we as we come before God today? Poor, humble, weak, broken-hearted, ill, exhausted, in need of God's mercy? God's face is always turned towards such people.

In the Mass today, the penitential rite is a great opportunity to stand in that place of humility with the tax-collector. Presiders sometimes use their own words to introduce the prayers of mercy.

I have heard one ask us to come to our God of love and compassion 'for forgiveness of our sins, for peace in our hearts and for healing in our lives'. Another calls us to 'reflect on our need for healing in our relationships with God, others, ourselves and our environment'.

The penitential rite is a great equaliser and reality-check; we can all recognise aspects of ourselves that are rough or broken. We come to receive Jesus' gift of himself in Communion not because we are perfect, but because we are in need of him. He wants to feed and nourish us because we are hungry and thirsty. If we come to him full of ourselves, we may not appreciate this gift and we may leave unchanged. So let us be open to God's mercy and healing today. Jesus is merciful love. Come to Him with repentant hearts and aim to grow in faith and humility.

# CATECHIST BIO

# Who am I?

My name is Val Dias and I currently live in St Ives, on the upper north shore. I am a homemaker responsible for managing the day-to-day operations of my household. My role involves preparing meals, childcare, school runs, extra-curricular activities after school, budgeting and household maintenance. I try my best to create a stable and nurturing environment for all the members of my household.

# **Family**

I met my husband at a youth conference organised by our local diocese in 2003 and we have been together ever since. We got married in 2010 and are blessed with two beautiful children. A boy who is 9 years old and our miracle baby girl, who is 2 years old.

# How long have you been a Catechist?

2.5 years and counting.

# What brought you to being a catechist?

Three years ago, when I was expecting my second child, after what seemed like a lifetime of praying for another child. I was filled with gratitude that God had finally answered my prayers and as a thank you to Him, wanted to render some service to the church/ community/faith as a form of giving back in any way possible.

It was then I heard the call to be a catechist at Sunday mass. I am sure they had many of those callings before 2022, but it did not resonate with me then. I simply didn't pay attention to it before.

This time however, due to my then state of mind, it spoke to me immediately. I remember vividly the advertisement said, "God chooses ordinary people to do extra-ordinary things." It was as if the ad was made only for me, I am an ordinary homemaker and God was calling me on an extra-ordinary journey to give back to the community.

# Why did you stay?

I feel my journey has only just begun, but I can see myself in this



long term. Due to my love for children and the desire to serve the church by helping little souls grow in their journey of faith. I feel that I have been entrusted with a grave responsibility to spread the word of God through my personal relationship and faith in Him.

# Why did you stay?

You don't have to be perfect and know everything about the teachings of the Bible and church to be a catechist. You just need to have a heart ready to share the faith, willing to learn, serve and walk with others on their journey of faith. If you feel drawn to it don't ignore it. God often calls the willing more than the ready. Pray about it, let the Holy Spirit guide you. If this is your calling God, will make a way and equip you for it.



# NOVEMBER IS A SPECIAL MONTH WHEN WE REMEMBER OUR DEPARTED LOVED ONES

Scripture says it is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for our departed beloved ones. Because of Jesus Christ, forgiveness and love crosses the grave. We may pray for them but they cannot pray for themselves. However, they can and will pray for us. I know of parents who had a six year old boy who had big behavioural problems. They tried counselling, which is a good thing to do, but to no avail. It turned out that the mother had a miscarriage. They had a mass said for the miscarried child and the behavioural difficulties of the living child were healed.

In terms of responding for your departed beloved ones, you may write the names in a special book we will have available. You may also have a special individual mass said for the person by writing the name of the person on the envelopes found in the foyer and put a small donation in it, which can be put in the collection bowl or handed in at the sacristy. There will also be candles available that you may light for a gold coin donation as well as an opportunity to bring in a small photo of a deceased family member/s that can be displayed in front of the Sacred Heart statue. At each Sunday mass we will remember your departed ones generally as well. Remember that forgiveness and love crosses the grave through Jesus Christ.

# First Reading

From the book of Sirach 35:12-14, 16-19

The prayer of the humble will penetrate the heavens.

The Lord is a judge who is no respecter of personages. He shows no respect of personages to the detriment of a poor man; he listens to the plea of the injured party. He does not ignore the orphan's supplication, nor the widow's as she pours out her story. The man who with his whole heart serves God will be accepted, his petitions will carry to the clouds. The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds, until it arrives he is inconsolable nor will he desist until the Most High takes notice of him, acquits the virtuous and delivers judgement. And the Lord will not be slow, nor will he be dilatory on their behalf.
