"I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven. Whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners,

The key to this Sunday's scripture is found in Paul's rhetorical question in the second reading: "Who could ever know the mind of the Lord?" Isaiah could have pose this question to Shebna and his replacement Eliakim, as one was supplanted by the other. In the Gospel, when Peter declares "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God" we know that Peter has only an inkling of what his declaration actually means. He has responded correctly without fully comprehending what he is saying. Yet his words are sufficient to be given an extensive affirmation of authority by Jesus: the keys of the kingdom and power to bind and loose. When, much later, Peter came to exercise this authority, perhaps Isaiah's oracle to Shebna, and Eliakim would remind him of its provisional nature. In our exercise of authority, large or small, may we remain conscious that is ultimately comes from God and is to be directed towards his kingdom.

#### Social Justice Corner

#### **Social Justice Sunday**

This weekend we are celebrating Social Justice Sunday. Since the 1940s, Australia's Catholic bishops have published annual statements that urge the Catholic community to reflect and act on social, economic and ecological issues. The statement for 2023-24 is Listen, Learn, Love: A new engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

Archbishop Timothy Costello SDB has said the heart of the statement was "a new engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples" after "much listening." Indigenous people needed to be "welcomed from the margins into the centre, so that they can lead the discussions about change and implementation about actions, to bring about healing and justice..... Change is necessary if the hopes and aspirations of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are to be realised. We can be at the forefront of a new era in Australia's public life," he said.

Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church. And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven: whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.'
