Dear Parishioners,

Imagine if we always followed Jesus' advice to take a look at our own failings before criticising others. We would never criticise anyone, and how much happier our lives and relationships would be. Jesus reminds us that our inner spiritual health can be gauged by how we live our life, by our actions, by the fruit we bear. If we regularly display virtues such as patience, honesty and courage, there is a fair chance that this good is coming from the store of goodness in our heart. If we are prone to bad temper, impatience, dishonesty and any number of other 'rotten fruits', then, as the Scripture passage says, it is likely we are drawing from a well of badness. How do we create a store of goodness in our heart then? Through staying close of Jesus in prayer, Word and sacrament and filling ourselves with his goodness. I love to listen to Christian music in the car and around the house, because it's one small way of regularly filling myself up with Scripture based goodness. We're still going to sin and make mistakes, but when we're drawing from the well of goodness in our heart, we're more likely to be able to share good fruits.



International Day of Fasting and Prayer for World Peace
Pope Francis has made a heartfelt appeal for peace in Ukraine
during the General Audience on Wednesday, stating that the
possibility of violence had given him "much pain" in his heart.
"Despite the diplomatic efforts of the last few week increasingly
alarming scenarios are opening up," Pope Francis urged that,
"all the parties involved refrain from any action that would cause
even more suffering to the people, destabilizing coexistence
between nations and bringing international law into disrepute."

Pope Francis has invited us to participate in an international day of fasting and prayer for world peace on Wednesday, March 2. "I invite everyone to make this coming 2nd March, Ash Wednesday, a Day of Fasting for Peace: let believers dedicate themselves intensively to prayer and fasting. May the Queen of Peace preserve the world from the madness of war."

If you have any palm trees, we are looking for small and large palsm to decorate the church. Please contact the Parish Office on 9144 6998.



NATIONAL CHURCH LIFE SURVEY- 5 & 6 MARCH

Our parish has been selected to participate in the National Church Life Survey on behalf of our Diocese which gives

useful information for planning in the context of the whole of Australia. It is also an opportunity to hear what people are really thinking whether they come to Church or not. We would be then in a better position to serve and care for them. We will receive our own parish report with survey results which we could share with you. The results would give us a basis for planning a positive future for those we serve. Please see below for some other reasons to participate.

Churches of all sizes and traditions, in urban, rural and remote communities, complete a *Church Life Survey*, as a way to reflect on their church's health and vitality.

'Life to the full' is the underlying philosophy as the survey aims to be a life-giving resource for churches, to nurture their vitality and inform their decision making, as they seek to be part of God's mission where they are.

- 1. Hear all the voices take time to listen Hear the attitudes and beliefs of all people at church, including those who don't always get heard: ministers, lay leaders, adult attenders, youth and children, at one time, in a season of listening.
- **2. Make better choices:** Use a credible evidence base to inform your discussions and decisions. Discern where best to place your energy and direction, based on your survey feedback.
- **3. Find out things you need to know:** As mission researchers, the NCLS team know things about what you care about. Doing a nation-wide survey helps churches to learn from each other and allows leaders to identify key trends.
- **4. Find out the giftings and hopes of attenders :** Receive a list of areas where your attenders are gifted and motivated to act. Harness their energy, motivation and hopes to move forward. Encourage all to contribute their gifts and skills.
- **5. Take stock of your church's health:** Beyond counting heads, use the NCLS Research framework of church vitality to assess nine core qualities and three attendance measures, at regular times in your church's journey.
- **6. Identify your strengths and use them to grow:** Survey results will show where your church's strengths lie. Identify your strengths and use them to inform areas of growth. Our planning resources are strengths-based, the best place to start when making any change.

First Reading

From the book of Ecclesiasticus Sir 27:4-7

Do not praise someone before they have spoken.

In a shaken sieve the rubbish is left behind, so too the defects of a man appear in his talk. The kiln tests the work of the potter, the test of a man is in his conversation. The orchard where the tree grows is judged on the quality of its fruit, similarly a man's words betray what he feels. Do not praise a man before he has spoken, since this is the test of men.

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 6:39-45

A person speaks from what is in his heart.

Jesus told a parable to his disciples, 'Can one blind man guide another? Surely both will fall into a pit?

The disciple is not superior to his teacher; the fully trained disciple will always be like his teacher. Why do you observe the splinter in your brother's eye and never notice the plank in your own? How can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me take out the splinter that is in your eye," when you cannot see the plank in your own? Hypocrite! Take the plank out of your own eye first, and then you will see clearly enough to take out the splinter that is in your brother's eye.

'There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit. For every tree can be told by its own fruit: people do not pick figs from thorns, nor gather grapes from brambles. A good man draws what is good from the store of goodness in his heart; a bad man draws what is bad from the store of badness. For a man's words flow out of what fills his heart.'
