# The tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed. (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector is one of the most beautiful of Jesus parables. It never loses its freshness and power to prompt me to reflect on my own

attitudes and behaviour. The Pharisee has done so many good and praiseworthy things, but his heart is not in the right place. He takes his stand and is sadly blind to the fact that he has forgotten that life is a gift from God, and that we are always in need of God's mercy. The Greek text gives the impression that he is speaking to himself rather than to God and this is his first mistake. The second is his condemnation of the tax collector. The tax collector, on the other hand has no illusions about himself and that enables him to see what the Pharisee so easily misses. The tax collector has taken the first important step—he looks at himself, and recognises his need and woundedness. There is room in his heart to accept the gift that God so eagerly wants to give. Here is a living example of what Ecclesiasticus conveyed so long ago—the prayer of the humble person goes straight to the heart of God.




# RETURN OF ULURU TO THE TRADITIONAL OWNERS

In October each year we celebrate the return of the title to Uluru's traditional owner. The handover of Uluru on the 26th October 1985 was a symbolic highpoint for land rights. Hundreds of Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal people attended the ceremony when Governor General Sir Ninian Stephen handed over the title deeds to Anangu traditional owners. Anangu then signed an agreement leasing the land back to the Australian Parks and Wildlife Service (now the Director of National Parks) for 99 years. The occasion formally acknowledged Anangu ownership of the park while at the same time recognising the value of their land as a park of national significance. The first Board chairman was Yami Lester - a former land rights campaigner and an executive member of the Pitjantjatjara Council. Uluru today is a natural wonder, a symbol of indigenous land rights and, for many, a source of spiritual connectedness with the continent. On the 26<sup>th</sup> October we celebrate the importance of keeping land and culture strong and supporting traditional owners to live on their land and teach their children and grandchildren as they were taught.



## Acknowledgement of Traditional Owners

We wish to acknowledge the traditional custodians of these lands on which we gather and show our respect to the Elders past and present. We also wish to pay our respects to all Aboriginal people.

I would encourage you to write the names of your departed beloved ones in this special book. We will bring this book with these names in the entrance procession to the front on Sunday masses during November and during these masses they will be especially remembered during the Eucharistic Prayer

I would also encourage you to use a November envelope for your departed beloved ones. In this way a special mass will be offered for the person(s). Write the name clearly with a small donation enclosed.

We will also remember them as a group as the names of all November Envelope mentioned individuals will be on slides before mass begins and they will be remembered in the Eucharistic Prayer. In this way at some time a unique mass is offered as well as being remembered during masses in November as a group.

So let us remember our departed loved ones during November in a special way so that they too may experience the fullness of glory experienced by all the saints.

#### The Word

Sunday 27 October 2019: 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C

#### First Reading

From the book of Ecclesiasticus Sir 35:12-14, 16-18

The prayer of the humble will penetrate the heavens. The Lord is a judge who is no respecter of personages. He shows no respect of personages to the detriment of a poor man; he listens to the plea of the injured party. He does not ignore the orphan's supplication, nor the widow's as she pours out her story. The man who with his whole heart serves God will be accepted, his petitions will carry to the clouds. The humble man's prayer pierces the clouds, until it arrives he is inconsolable nor will he desist until the Most High takes notice of him, acquits the virtuous and delivers judgement. And the Lord will not be slow, nor will he be dilatory on their behalf.

From the second letter of St Paul to Timothy 2 Tm 4:6-8, 16-18

All that remains is the crown of righteousness reserved for me.

My life is already being poured away as a libation, and the time has come for me to be gone. I have fought the good fight to the end; I have run the race to the finish; I have kept the faith; all there is to come now is the crown of righteousness reserved for me, which the Lord, the righteous judge, will give to me on that Day; and not only to me but to all those who have longed for his Appearing.

The first time I had to present my defence, there was not a single witness to support me. Every one of them deserted me – may they not be held accountable for it. But the Lord stood by me and gave me power, so that through me the whole message might be proclaimed for all the pagans to hear; and so I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The tax collector stood some distance away, not daring even to raise his eyes to heaven; but he beat his breast and said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." This man, I tell you, went home again at rights with God; the other did not. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'
