Dear Parishioners,

To contemplate the scene of the Transfiguration we need to 'go up the mountain with Jesus', leaving behind our worries and concerns. On the

mountain Jesus appeared to Peter, James and John in all his glory as the Son of God. Peter wanted to hold on to that experience and stay on the mountain, offering to build a few tents!

It was while he was praying to his heavenly Father that Jesus was transfigured. The same can be the case for us. Each time we pray and seek to be in communion with the Father, we too can experience being transfigured or transformed by God's presence. Very real changes can take place when we encounter Christ in prayer. An inner transformation can take place as our faith, hope and love are restored or renewed. And even a physical change can happen, the glow returns to our eyes, we smile again, and our shoulders are no longer weighed down.

Jesus' communion with his Father in the prayer of Transfiguration strengthened him to face the cross. We too need experience of tasting heaven on earth in order to face the challenges of the cross in our own life. Lord, help us to taste and see heaven on earth. Lord, transform us!

SOCIAL JUSTICE CORNER:

JobSeeker Decision

The Federal Government has announced that when the coronavirus supplement ends on the 31st March 2021, there will only be a \$25 a week increase to the JobSeeker payment. The small increase has been widely condemned by non-government organisations, business leaders and unions.

Claire Victory, President of The National Council of the St Vincent de Paul Society in Australia stated "Twenty-five dollars a week is an inadequate response to the poverty experienced by the people forced survive on unemployment benefits. It's an affront to human dignity."

The National Council has repeated the call for the establishment of a Social Security Expert Group to provide advice on payment levels to keep people out of poverty. "Such a move would take the politics out of the decision-making process and would come closer to delivering in line with expectations for the common good of our community. All pensions and income support payments must now be brought into line until such an expert group is established. This would require an increase to Newstart of around \$370 a fortnight, not the \$50 announced," Ms Victory explained

The Word

Sunday 28 February 2021: Second Sunday of Lent

First Reading

From the book of Genesis Gen Gen 22:1-2. 9-13. 15-18

The sacrifice of Abraham, our father in faith. God put Abraham to the test. 'Abraham, Abraham,' he called.' Here I am' he replied. 'Take your son,' God said 'your only child Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him as a burnt offering, on a mountain I will point out to you.'

When they arrived at the place God had pointed out to him, Abraham built an altar there, and arranged the wood. Then he bound his son Isaac and put him on the altar on top of the wood. Abraham stretched out his hand and seized the knife to kill his son. But the angel of the Lord called to him from heaven. 'Abraham, Abraham' he said. 'I am here' he replied. 'Do not raise your hand against the boy' the angel said. 'Do not harm him, for now I know you fear God. You have not refused me your son, your only son.' Then looking up, Abraham saw a ram caught by its horns in a bush. Abraham took the ram and offered it as a burnt offering in place of his son.

The angel of the Lord called Abraham a second time from heaven. 'I swear by my own self – it is the Lord who speaks – because you have done this, because you have not refused me your son, your only son, I will shower blessings on you, I will make your descendants as many as the stars of heaven and the grains of sand on the seashore. Your descendants shall gain possession of the gates of your enemies. All the nations of the earth shall bless themselves by your descendants, as a reward for your obedience.'

From the first letter of St Paul to the Romans Rom 8:31-34

God did not spare his own Son.

With God on our side who can be against us? Since God did not spare his own Son, but gave him up to benefit us all, we may be certain, after such a gift, that he will not refuse anything he can give. Could anyone accuse those that God has chosen? When God acquits, could anyone condemn? Could Christ Jesus? No! He not only died for us – he rose from the dead, and there at God's right hand he stands and pleads for us.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 9:2-10

This is my Son, the beloved; listen to him. Jesus took with him Peter and James and John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone by themselves. There in their presence he was transfigured: his clothes became dazzlingly white, whiter than any earthly bleacher could make them. Elijah appeared to them with Moses; and they were talking with Jesus. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Rabbi,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say; they were so frightened. And a cloud came, covering them in shadow; and there came a voice from the cloud, 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Then suddenly, when they looked round, they saw no one with them any more but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain he warned them to tell no one what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead. They observed the warning faithfully, though among themselves they discussed what 'rising from the dead' could mean.
