# Father Abraham, have pity on me. Send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue (Gospel)

Dear parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The story of Lazarus and the Rich Man is a sobering tale of the eternal consequences of the way in which we live our life.

The rich man, who, in life, would not even give Lazarus the scraps from his table, finds himself in Hades, while Lazarus is

embraced in the bosom of Abraham.

Is this a story about the evils of being rich? No, but Jesus tells this story as a warning to us of the importance of compassion. All through the Bible we see God's special compassion for the poor, the neglected, the marginalized.

In today's Gospel reading we hear the rich man beg not only for relief for himself in his afterlife of suffering, but also that a warning be sent to his five brothers. Abraham, however, points to all the unheeded warnings sent through history, from the prophets to Jesus himself.

The time for living with compassion towards those in need is now. We cannot wait. We don't know when our time on earth will be over and we do not want to end up like the rich man, regretting our choices and paying an eternal price.

# **International Day of Peace**

the lead-up to the International Day

of Peace on 21 September, Caritas Australia convened a coalition of Catholic organizations to issue a united call for an immediate ceasefire and urgent humanitarian access in Gaza. The joint statement, titled Australian Catholics for Peace in Gaza, urges the Australian Government and the international community to act decisively to protect the lives and dignity of civilians caught in the escalating crisis. "At least 60,000 people, including over 17,000 children, have been killed in Gaza. The situation is only getting worse," the statement reads. "We are deeply concerned about the escalating starvation crisis, especially among children. The lack of food, baby formula, clean water, and essential medical supplies is already costing lives."

The statement calls for respect for humanitarian law, a ceasefire, the return of hostages, unimpeded humanitarian access, the abandonment of plans to intensify offensive actions in Gaza, and the suspension of the trade in weapons, including components.

Bishop Tim Harris, Chair of the Bishops Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service, reflected on the statement saying, "The suffering in Gaza calls us to respond not with silence, but with steadfast compassion and moral clarity. Peace is not merely the absence of violence; it is the presence of justice, mercy, and respect for human dignity. Where peace is absent, the Church must stand united in prayer and action, urging all leaders to protect life, for in every person we see the face of Christ."

The collective call from Catholic organisations in Australia reflects the Church's enduring commitment to peace and justice. It echoes the position of Pope Leo XIV, who has consistently advocated for the protection of human dignity and the pursuit of peace through nonviolence and diplomacy.

### A letter to the People of God in the Parish of St Ives

23 September 2025

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I am very grateful for the presence in the parish this weekend of Fr Bernard Hancock OCD, Regional Vicar of the Discalced Carmelite Fathers of Australia.

As I wrote to the Parish of St Ives four years ago on 12 May 2022, it has been a difficult decision of the Carmelite Order to relinquish the pastoral care of the Parish after fourteen years of remarkable service. This is a great loss to both the Parish and to our Diocese more generally. However, the Order has made this decision from its own processes of discernment, and this I accept. Notwithstanding, I wish to convey my deep gratitude to Fr Bernard and to the Order for continuing in their care of the Parish over the four years since the Order's discernment. I convey my deep appreciation to Fr Greg Chee OCD and the friars in residence who have supported him and the parish community since this discernment was made public. I also express my gratitude to the Parish as a whole, for the development of a new presbytery over this time which has ensured that the future priests to be appointed to the Parish might be accommodated.

I am pleased to share that the Friars will continue with care of the Parish of St Ives until the weekend of 18/19 April 2026. This will enable them to celebrate the great event of Easter with the community and also provide the opportunity to be farewelled fittingly by the community. Prior to Easter, I shall be able to share the news of the appointment of two priests of the Diocese to the community. I am confident that they will be welcomed with that warmth of spirit for which the Parish is known and which the Friars have experienced so generously over these years. They will be building on the great foundation of these past years.

I continue to keep the Order and the Parish in my prayer during this significant time of transition and extend my blessing to you all.

# Reconciliation

Why go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation? People sometimes ask. *Isn't it enough to say sorry* to God in my heart? The Catholic approach to Reconciliation is deeply community— oriented. For us, sin is never a private affair. When one member of the body of Christ hurts, the whole body suffers. Imagine a husband and wife who harshly criticize each other. They can regret their words and say sorry to God. But for the forgiveness of God to really take effect in their marriage, they also need to reconcile with one another. Similarly, in Reconciliation we offer a public sign to our faith community that we are sorry for the ways we have undermined the unity of the Church and that we desire to renew our relationship with or brothers and sisters in Christ.



#### Collect

O God, who manifest your almighty power above all by pardoning and showing mercy, bestow, we pray, your grace abundantly upon us and make those hastening to attain your promises heirs to the treasures of heaven.

#### First Reading

From the prophet Amos Am 6:1. 4-7

You who give yourself to licentiousness and revelry will be exiled.

The almighty Lord says this: Woe to those ensconced so snugly in Zion and to those who feel so safe on the mountain of Samaria. Lying on ivory beds and sprawling on their divans, they dine on lambs from the flock, and stall-fattened veal; they bawl to the sound of the harp, they invent new instruments of music like David, they drink wine by the bowlful, and use the finest oil for anointing themselves, but about the ruin of Joseph they do not care at all. That is why they will be the first to be exiled; the sprawlers' revelry is over.

#### Gospel

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 16:19-31

During your life good things came your way just as bad things came the way of Lazarus.

Now he is being comforted while you are in agony. Jesus said to the Pharisees: 'There was a rich man who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast magnificently every day. And at his gate there lay a poor man called Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to fill himself with the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even came and licked his sores. Now the poor man died and was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. 'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things come your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours." 'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning, so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham "let them listen to them." "Ah no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."
