"Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

As we hear the various accounts of the appearances of the risen Christ to his disciples we notice that oftentimes they did not recognise him. There was something in his

physical appearance that was different. Mary Magdalen thought he was the gardener: it was only when he uttered 'Mary' that she recognised him. The two disciples on the road to Emmaus journeyed with him for some hours without recognising him. The disciples fishing on the lake initially failed to recognise that the man on the shore was Jesus.

But while his physical appearance may have been different, there is an absolute consistency in his person and teaching. Throughout his earthly ministry Jesus constantly taught about the need forgiveness. We must forgive those who wrong is not 7 times but 77 times (that is always). We must pray each day, 'forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.' And here, in this first appearance to the disciples in the upper room, he immediately talks about forgiveness— 'for those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven, for those whose sins you retain they are retained.'

In these words lie the biblical basis for the sacrament of reconciliation or Confession. But they have relevance for all of us as we all have the possibility to forgive others or to hold them in unforgiveness. And what a terrible thing it would be for ourselves and the other if we hold them in unforgiveness. Let us always remember that while forgiveness cannot change the past it can make a future possible. On this divine Mercy Sunday, as we contemplate the forgiveness of God, let us pray for the graces we need to extend forgiveness and mercy to others.

SERRA VOCATIONS MASS AND DINNER MEETING



Divine Mercy Sunday

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. God's mercy, forgiveness, compassion and fidelity are dominant themes in scripture. Think of the Prodigal Son or the Woman caught in the very act of adultery.

Pope John Paul II underscored what we hear and read in sacred scripture over and over again in his 1980 Encyclical "Rich in Mercy." He says:

"The Church lives an authentic life when She professes and proclaims mercy, the most stupendous attribute of the creator and of the redeemer and when She brings people close to the source of the Saviours Mercy, of which she is the trustee and dispenser."

Every one of us are entirely dependent on God's merciful love for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3), but if we want mercy we also need to be merciful and forgiving to others. In the Our Father, we pray show me mercy as I show mercy to others, ("forgive us our trespasses as we forgive them who trespass against us"). So, it is imperative that we show mercy and forgiveness to others if we are to receive Gods mercy. Think of the Unforgiving Debtor in Matthew 18:21-35.

How may we show mercy to others?

There are two main ways: Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy.

Spiritual Works: For example praying for the dead or bringing others to Christ, the source of all Mercy. This can be achieved through Alpha as it deepens our relationship with Christ. At the Alpha sessions we have an enjoyable meal; we watch a video on an aspect of faith such as: "Is There More to Life Than This?" "Who is Jesus and Why Did he Die?" We then have a cup of tea or coffee and in small groups share something of our responses, if we chose to. No question is too simple, and no question is too adverse. Because we are in the same group each week, over time real friendships are developed.

I invite you to really take the opportunity to come to Alpha. It is fun, interactive and has the potential to allow you and others to come to the Source of Mercy, namely Jesus in a personal way. It also has the potential to share that opportunity with others. Please see opposite page for how to register. Registrations are beginning to fill and there are limited spaces. Don't delay to avoid disappointment.

Corporal Works of Mercy: are kind acts by which we help our neighbours with their material and physical needs such as; feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, burying the dead, giving alms to the poor. Jesus said in Matthew 25:35 "When I was hungry, you gave me something to eat, and when I was thirsty, you gave me something to drink. When I was a stranger, you welcomed me..."

If we want to be the recipient of God's mercy, forgiveness, compassion and fidelity, we must come to really know and understand Christ. That requires us to embrace both spiritual and corporal works of mercy to experience Christ's Divine Mercy.

The Word

Sunday 28 April 2019: Second Sunday of Easter - Year C

First Reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Acts 5:12-16

The numbers of men and women who came to believe in the Lord increased steadily.

The faithful all used to meet by common consent in the Portico of Solomon. No one else ever dared to join them, but the people were loud in their praise and the numbers of men and women who came to believe in the Lord increased steadily. So many signs and wonders were worked among the people at the hands of the apostles that the sick were even taken out into the streets and laid on beds and sleeping-mats in the hope that at least the shadow of Peter might fall across some of them as he went past. People even came crowding in from the towns round about Jerusalem, bringing with them their sick and those tormented by unclean spirits, and all of them were cured. The Word of the Lord.

Second Reading

A reading from the book of the Apocalypse Rv 1:9-13, 17-19

I was dead and now I am to live for ever and ever. My name is John, and through our union in Jesus I am your brother and share your sufferings, your kingdom, and all you endure. I was on the island of Patmos for having preached God's word and witnessed for Jesus; it was the Lord's day and the Spirit possessed me, and I heard a voice behind me, shouting like a trumpet, 'Write down all that you see in a book.' I turned round to see who had spoken to me, and when I turned I saw seven golden lamp-stands and, surrounded by them, a figure like a Son of man, dressed in a long robe tied at the waist with a golden girdle. When I saw him, I fell in a dead faint at his feet, but he touched me with his right hand and said, 'Do not be afraid; it is I, the First and the Last; I am the Living One. I was dead and now I am to live for ever and ever, and I hold the keys of death and of the underworld. Now write down all that you see of present happenings and things that are still to come.'

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John Jn 20:19-31

After eight days Jesus came in and stood among them.

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
