"Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

My mum always haggled for anything she bought from the market. I used to imagine that we were destitute, only to find out later that she was only trying to stretch the family's budget. In our first reading we find Abraham as he 'haggled' with God in the same way mum haggled with the vendors in the market. But Abraham haggled with God himself and not with vendors in the market. Abraham did not haggle for vegetables, chicken, fish or meat; he entreated God for the salvation of the people of Sodom

Out of his deep compassion towards his people, Abraham pleads with God six times and each time Abraham received a positive answer from God. He said he will not destroy Sodom if he finds at least ten righteous persons in the city. On hindsight, we can ask Abraham: Why did you stop bargaining at ten? God did not show any sign of exasperation. God never stopped giving; it was Abraham who stopped asking. In the end, not even ten righteous persons were found in Sodom. Only four remained—Lot, Lot's wife, and their two daughters. Lot's wife, alas!, disobeyed God, turned around, and was transformed into a pillar of salt. Thus, finally only three righteous persons were left in Sodom and soon the city was destroyed.

Today, we reflect on Abraham as a missionary to Sodom. He knew that evil was widespread in Sodom, but did not realise its catastrophic proportion. Abraham had to admit the painful truth that he did not know the people of Sodom full well. He also did not know God full well since he put a limit to God's power to forgive. In the end, it was the sin of Sodom that brought about its destruction.

Jesus teaches us to persevere in prayer as we dedicate our life to mission. We need not put limits to God's power over our life unlike Abraham. We can keep asking God because he wants to keep giving. When our best efforts are reduced to failure, Jesus admonishes us not to despair: 'Ask and keep asking, seek and keep seeking, knock and keep knocking.' In effect, Jesus is telling us: 'Ultimately, it's not about you; it's about me.'

Mass of Acknowledgement of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, Sunday 4th August 2019 at 10am

Next Sunday, 4th August, at the 10 am Mass, Corpus Christi Parish will be celebrating a special Mass to acknowledge the contribution of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the Australian Catholic Church and wider community.

As part of the celebration, Mr Laurie Bimson will conduct a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony prior to the start of Mass. Mr Bimson is a noted Guringai man and will welcome us to the land of his ancestors. The Mass will include special prayers including the Aboriginal "Our Father."

At the conclusion of Mass, Fr Greg will bless the acknowledgement plaque, which will be affixed to the church wall in the garden near the front entrance. The plaque is a symbol of welcome for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and an acknowledgment that our parish has an understanding of Australia's past.


Jesus is the way the truth and the life. Our relationship





The Word

Sunday 28 July 2019: 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C

First Reading

From the book of Genesis Gen 18:20-32

Lord, do not be angry if I speak.

The Lord said, 'How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.' The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, 'Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?' The Lord replied, 'If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.' Abraham replied, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this to my Lord, I who am dust and ashes. But perhaps the fifty just men lack five: will you destroy the whole city for five?' 'No', he replied 'I will not destroy it if I find forty-five just men there.' Again Abraham said to him, 'Perhaps there will only be forty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied 'for the sake of the forty.' Abraham said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry, but give me leave to speak: perhaps there will only be thirty there.' 'I will not do it' he replied 'if I find thirty there.' He said, 'I am bold indeed to speak like this, but perhaps there will only be twenty there.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the twenty.' He said, 'I trust my Lord will not be angry if I speak once more; perhaps there will only be ten.' 'I will not destroy it' he replied 'for the sake of the ten.'

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 11:1-13

Ask, and it will be given to you.

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.' He said to them, 'Say this when you pray:

"Father, may your name be held holy, your kingdom come; give us each day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins, for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us. And do not put us to the test,"

He also said to them, 'Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say. "My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him"; and the man answers from inside the house, "Do not bother me. The door is bolted now. and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you." I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship's sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants. 'So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask
