Jesus said to his apostles: "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners,

During the time of the Old Testament patriarchs, when both the nature of the terrain and the constant threat of

misadventure made hospitality a necessity, it was regarded as a sacred duty to welcome guests and to provide for them with honour—a tradition that endures to this day, at least in some parts of the Holy Land. A good example is to be found in our first reading from the Second Book of the Kings. Rather extravagantly, 'a woman of rank' welcomes the prophet Elisha and his servant Gehazi and offers them food and purpose-built accommodation. Jesus himself both gave and received hospitality (at the home of Martha, Mary and Lazarus to give but one example) during the busy years of his itinerant public ministry. In today's excerpt from his discourse on mission he affirms the importance of such conduct and points to its deeper significance. 'Anyone who welcomes you,' he says to his disciples, 'welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me.' Mindful of today's refugee crisis, Pope Francis reminds us that 'authentic hospitality of a profound Gospel value'; and Peter, addressing the Christians in Rome, says: 'Make hospitality your special care' (Rom 12:21)

OUR VISION TO DATE-FR GREG CHEE:

- Corpus Christi is a welcoming joyful growing faith community with Jesus at the heart of parish, and Mary as our Spiritual Mother; we are inspired by our Carmelite spirituality and other authentic spirituality's; we bring people to Christ, form disciples and send them out to transform the world.
- As a community and individually we are committed to grow; to serve; to connect; to pray; to worship; actively sharing our gifts in the power of the Spirit as missionary disciples in the world.

Today I will take a different tact. I will share with you a few pertinent words from Bishop Anthony's message in the BBNeighbourhoods on the 23rd of June and then relate them to our vision and to Jesus himself:

"I would like to propose to you that this call, is common to all the baptised. It is our commission to be evangelists of the Good News of Jesus Christ. Evangelists are called to share Christ with others. The next step is to acknowledge that we belong to an evangelising community. Pope Francis reminds us that an evangelising community gets involved in people's lives and stands by people every step of the way, no matter how difficult or lengthy the journey. (cf The Joy of the Gospel, ²⁴). This is an essential part of our mission and will cause us to have a daily concern to spread the love and goodness of God. It can be challenging work; however it is not without its rewards. The desire to share our Christian joy is itself a gift from God who has taken the initiative of loving us first. This week, I encourage you to spend some quiet time in prayer and contemplation with the Lord. Discover and re-discover what God's saving love has done and doing in your life. Then, go out and proclaim that love as a witness to the Gospel, the Good News of Jesus Christ."

This clearly relates to our vision where it says: "As a community and individually we are committed to grow to serve; to connect; to pray; to worship; actively sharing our gifts in the power of the Spirit as missionary disciples in the world". In keeping with Jesus' words: "Go make disciples of all nations". (Mt 28)

Pope Francis has released a short video in the lead up to the Church's celebration of the World Day of Migrants and Refugees on the 27th September 2020. The theme chosen by Pope Francis is "Forced like Jesus Christ to flee". The theme places the experiences of Jesus as a child, displaced and a refugee together with his parents at the centre of our reflection. Pope Francis urges us to put aside our fears and prejudices in order to come close to people to love and serve them. The video offers the real-life testimony of an internally displaced person who describes the solidarity of generous people who saved his life.





Sunday 28 June 2020: Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year A

First Reading

From the second book of the Kings 2 Kgs 4:8-11. 14-16

That is the holy man of God, let him remain there. One day as Elisha was on his way to Shunem, a woman of rank who lived there pressed him to stay and eat there. After this he always broke his journey for a meal when he passed that way. She said to her husband, 'Look, I am sure the man who is constantly passing our way must be a holy man of God. Let us build him a small room on the roof, and put him a bed in it, and a table and chair and lamp; whenever he comes to us he can rest there.'

One day when he came, he retired to the upper room and lay down. 'What can be done for her?' he asked. Gehazi (his servant) answered, 'Well, she has no son and her husband is old.' Elisha said, 'Call her.' The servant called her and she stood at the door. 'This time next year,' Elisha said 'you will hold a son in your arms.'

Having been buried with him through baptism, we shall walk in a new life.

When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life.

But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him anymore. When he died, he died, once for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.
