Dear Parishioners,

Notable for its intensity of feeling, Psalm 22 (21) is the lament of a good person who trusted in the Lord and yet endured immense suffering. The psalmist's situation of distress is described graphically but the sacred writer never loses hope in God. The psalm ends with a promise to thank God publicly once the person has been saved by God from the ordeal.

The early Christian community saw in this psalm an expression of the turmoil and suffering Jesus must have experienced on the cross, and his trust in the rescue of God. It is well worth praying in its entirety as we begin Holy Week. It will enable us to enter intimately into the feelings of Jesus as he endured his passion.

Today's first reading speaks of another faithful servant of God who endured immense suffering. And we know that there are many good people in our world today who are enduring great suffering at the hands of evil people. We remember them during this Holy Week and pray that they also may be saved from their torment. Let us promise to thank God in the assembly once they too are released from their distress.

PARISH HALL TRESTLE TABLES – POSSIBLE REPLACEMENT

Anyone who has had to move, assemble or store the trestle tables in the Church Hall will know that these tables are heavy (27kgs to 32kgs) and require some physical effort to set up and put-away.

The Parish Finance Committee is currently looking into the replacement of these trestle tables with more modern products that fold and are much lighter (just over 12kgs). They will also be easier to store. **We estimate the replacement cost to be approximately \$1,065.**

A sample trestle table has been provided for use in the Church Hall. Anyone using the Church Hall is encouraged to use this new table whenever possible and to let us know if they see any reason why it is not suitable or if there is a better alternative.

There is a sign attached to the table with contact details for any communication regarding problems or alternatives.

What happens to the old trestle tables if they are replaced?

If the current trestle tables are replaced, the Parish Finance Committee will be looking to find another home for the old trestle tables (we will try facilities such as Gumtree/eBay etc to hopefully get some value for them to help pay for the new ones).



Call to Prayer for Justice and Peace in Myanmar

On Palm Sunday we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on a donkey. Jesus accepts death on a cross rather than engaging in violence. The contrast between the Prince of Peace and the powers and dominions of his day could not be starker. This is the basis of the Palm Sunday tradition of protest in favour of peace and non-violent alternatives for addressing social, ecological and economic and political issues. The Office of Social Justice is inviting parishes to pray today for justice and peace in Myanmar.

Procession of Palms Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Mark 11:1-10

"Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord"
When they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, and said to them, 'Go into the village opposite you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat; untie it and bring it. If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" say, "The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately"'. And they went away, and found a colt tied at the door out in the open street; and they untied it. And those who stood there said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' And they told them what Jesus had said; and they let them go. And they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their garments on it; and he sat upon it. And many spread their garments on the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields. And those who went before and those who followed cried out, 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is coming! Hosanna in the highest!'
