Dear Parishioners,

Another liturgical year has ended, and we stand at a new beginning. Advent has a two-pronged message.

Firstly, we remember and celebrate, and secondly we look forward to Christ's coming in glory.. What wonderful readings we have to lead us into this season! Jeremiah reminds us of the Lord's long-ago promise that ' a virtuous branch' from David's line would come to 'practise honesty and integrity'. This immediately encourages us to ponder the wonder of Christ's birth which we celebrate at Christmas. The Gospel reminds us that Christ will come again and calls on us to trust in God at all times and in all circumstances. Between these two readings the psalm confidentially asks for God's help, trusting in the Lord's goodness and uprightness, faithfulness and love. In the second reading Paul prays for the Thessalonians asking the Lord to increase their love and to help them live as God desires. Perhaps 'the keys' to the joy of Advents are to live with anticipation, with love, and to fulfil another of God's promises: 'you shall be holy, for I am holy' (Leviticus 11:45; 1 Peter 1:16).

Advent 1:23 – A Christmas Initiative We are excited to let you know that our parish is taking part in the Broken Bay Advent 1:23 initiative to spread Christmas joy this year by extending an invitation to our family, friends, neighbours and colleagues to join us for Christmas Masses. Do you have family or friends who have disconnected from their faith that you would like to come to know Jesus? Do you have neighbours or coworkers who you would like to invite to the parish? Are there parishioners perhaps who you have not seen for a while and would like to invite back? Advent 1:23 encourages each of us all to invite people to Christmas Masses this year. Special cards are available at Masses to take home and write down the names of people that come to mind. We are asked to pray at 1:23pm each day for these people, through the power of the Holy Spirit, that they may be open to attend Christmas Mass and to encounter Jesus. They will also be prayed for at each Mass in the Parish during Advent. It is our prayers that will underpin this initiative and allow us to collaborate with God in drawing people to faith. The title of this initiative is based on Matthew 1:23, "Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel' which means, 'God is with us.'" Our prayer will be that those for whom we pray may come to know that God is with them during this Christmas season, and that they may come into relationship with God's Son Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit. We are planning to form welcome teams to ensure that everyone is made very welcome during Christmas Mass. Please consider being part of this welcoming taskforce. ### The John Mac Foundation (JMF)

The John Mac Foundation (JMF) is a small volunteer-run, registered charity with a big goal: supporting disadvantaged students from refugee backgrounds to achieve their full potential at university and beyond. In partnership with Western Sydney University, JMF provides scholarships to people from refugee, humanitarian and other disadvantaged backgrounds to support access to university education, career mentoring and opportunities for meaningful employment. They believe that everyone deserves access to a quality education, no matter where you are from or how deep your pockets are.

JMF was founded by 2017 NSW Australian of the Year Deng Adut, who was rescued from life as a child soldier in South Sudan by his brother John Mac. Together, with the support of the Australian community, they started a new life in Western Sydney, learned English and graduated from university - some of the first South Sudanese refugees to do so. While Deng ultimately became a lawyer, his brother John Mac Acuek was unable to find meaningful work in Australia despite his university qualifications. To support his young family, John Mac returned to South Sudan to undertake humanitarian work and tragically lost his life in 2014 defending a South Sudanese village from armed forces. Since inception, JMF has awarded 11 scholarships so that others are not held back by the same issues. JMF is currently chaired by Social Justice Group member Dr Judith Preston and is celebrating its fifth anniversary this year by fundraising for a new round of scholarships over the Christmas period.
