The blind man replied "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you" (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The blind Bartimaeus is the symbol of our journey to God. Like Bartimaeus, often we too are blind: We do not see the evil that we commit; we do not perceive the need of others; at times we close our eyes to the injustices and oppressions that

surround us; at other times, we do not recognise Jesus who passes by us. The physical blindness arrests free movement of a person. The spiritual blindness blocks our relationship with God and with one another. Today, Jesus invites us to overcome our spiritual blindness following certain steps as suggested in the Gospel. First of all, we must recognise our inability to overcome our blindness on our own. Secondly, we must rely upon the power of God who can only change us and lead us to salvation. Thirdly, we must overcome the obstacles on our way to encounter Jesus as Bartimaeus did. Finally, we give expression to our intense desire and hope in prayer and cry out with Bartimaeus: 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me' (Mk 10:47).

In terms of seeing the needs of others and the plight of the poor we have an outworking of the above in St Vincent de Paul. This Sunday at the 10am Eucharist we celebrate a festival mass for that society in the installation of two presidents. We give praise and thanks to God for their service in seeing and contributing to those in real need by being good news to the poor.

PRAYING FOR THOSE IN OUR FAMILY TREE AND FRIENDS WHO HAVE GONE BEFORE US IN NOVEMBER


