Yet, O Lord, you are our father; we are the clay and you the potter: we are all the work of your hand.

(First Reading)

Dear Parishioners,

Jesus uses a number of vigorous verbs in this Gospel to describe the behaviour he wants to see in us as we await his coming: we are to 'be alert', to be 'awake'. These are all applied to our ordinary existence. Yes, the daily round that doesn't seem important in the eyes of the world is precious in the eyes of God as it is in daily life that the kingdom of God is unfolding for us. If we look with the eyes of faith we will find a meaning in our ordinary activities that has eternal significance. The smallest actions of love charm the heart of God and allows us to make this world a better place leading to everlasting life in the next. We do not drift into this kingdom or find ourselves within it by default. God wants us to actively and effectively participate in making his kingdom a reality in our world.

It takes great daily courage to take these words to heart but when we do our lives, our often very humble lives, attain a meaning and depth that cannot come from human sources. Judgement will be made, not upon what presentation we may be able to drum up at the lastminute, but rather on what we do day-by-day when no-one is around. When we trust the plan that God has for our lives, the grace of the Spirit opens our eyes to infinite vistas in the confined spaces of our daily life.

A reading from the prophet Isaiah Is 63:16-17; 64:1. 3-8

Oh that you would tear the heavens apart and come down.

You, Lord, vourself are our Father. Our Redeemer is your ancient name. Why, Lord, leave us to stray from your ways and harden our hearts against fearing you? Return, for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your inheritance. Oh, that you would tear the heavens open and come down - at your Presence the mountains would melt. No ear has heard, no eye has seen any god but you act like this for those who trust him. You guide those who act with integrity and keep your ways in mind. You were angry when we were sinners; we had long been rebels against you. We were all like men unclean, all that integrity of ours like filthy clothing.
