"You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. ... You shall love your neighbour as yourself". (<u>Gospel</u>)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The Scriptures offer a profound and multi-faceted revelation of God. In different situations God is revealed as a judge, as saviour, as servant, as creator as father, as mother, as lover, etc. One of the most powerful and perhaps shocking images we find, especially in the book of Exodus, is of God as a warrior who frees the Israelites from slavery by slaying the enemies.

Clearly God, the warrior, is not one to ignore. The Israelites would not have treated lightly the Lord's threat to kill them with the sword if they molested, or oppressed the stranger in the mist or treated widows and orphans harshly.

This warrior God is praised in today's responsorial psalm. The Scriptures put this psalm on the lips of David after the Lord had rescued him from the clutches of his enemies. Using military images, David praises the Lord for being his fortress, his shield, his stronghold, and his mighty strength against his foes.


The image of God as a warrior can be very disturbing. We need to say that what motivates the Lord to be a warrior is a deep love for those who are oppressed. We can think of the fierce love of parents who will do anything to protect their vulnerable children.

We cannot love this God without also loving God's people. Not to love our neighbour is to put ourselves at enmity with God. Today's first reading urges us to adopt a wide definition of neighbour. The stranger in our mist will always be the object of the special love of our warrior God.

NOVEMBER IS A SPECIAL MONTH WHEN WE REMEMBER OUR DEPARTED LOVED ONES

On All Souls Day we often hear the expression: "It is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed of their sins." What is the biblical basis of this? What implications does it have for you and me?

In 2 Maccabees 12:42-46 Judas Maccabeus was the leader of the Jewish people one hundred and fifty years before the birth of Jesus. He led an army against the Greek invaders who had taken over his country. Several of his men were killed in battle. It turned out that all of them had been wearing superstitious amulets or charms around their necks, a practice that was totally opposed to their Jewish faith. When Judas Maccabeus discovered this, he took up a collection among all the people and sent two thousand drachmas to the Temple in Jerusalem to have sacrifices offered for those who had died.

"If he had not expected the fallen to rise again it would have been superfluous and foolish to pray for the dead, whereas if he had in view the splendid recompense for those who make a pious end, the thought was holy and devout. That is why he had this atonement sacrifice offered for the dead, so that they might be released from their sin", (2 Maccabees 12: 44-45).


"It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed of their sins." Praying for your departed beloved ones is an exercise of charity which brings graces not only for those who are held in our prayers but for ourselves as well. St John of the Cross tells us that in the eventide of life we will be examined in love. Praying for the dead is such an act.

Those in purgatory are certain of the experience of heaven. We speed them to experience the fullness of glory with the help of our prayers. Hence when St Monica knew she was dying she said: "I only ask that you remember me in your prayer". St Maria Faustina, through her conversations with Our Lord and Our Lady as recorded in her diary, including her own beautiful prayers and, of course, the Divine Mercy Chaplet, show this important work of mercy—praying for the dying souls and those in purgatory.

St Faustina was told by the souls in purgatory that the main way to avoid purgatory is to do the will of God in all things. She wrote: "How very easy it is to become holy; all that is needed is a bit of good will. If Jesus sees this little bit of good will in the soul, He hurries to give Himself to that soul, and nothing can stop Him, neither shortcomings nor falls—absolutely nothing (291). May you be blessed, O God, for everything You send me. Nothing under the sun happens without Your will (1208)

Hence I encourage you to pray for your departed beloved ones by making a small donation and putting it in an envelope found in the foyer. You can put this in a collection bowl or hand it in at the sacristy.

What a great morning we had celebrating the 79th Anniversary of the building of the original Corpus Christi Church.




Pray and Play is for babies, toddlers, and primary school children together with their families.



Collect

Almighty ever-living God, increase our faith, hope and charity and make us love what you command so that we may merit what you promise. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your son, who lives and reigns with you I n the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

A reading from the book of Exodus Ex 22:20-26

If you are harsh with the widow or the orphan, my anger will rage against you.

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans. "If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him.

"If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."

Second Reading

From the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians 1:5-10

You turned away from idols to serve God and await his Son.

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread – and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.

The second resembles it: you must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'
