Dear fellow Parishioners,

Fr Greg and the Finance Committee thank all Parishioners for their ongoing support of our Parish and Priests. It is encouraging to see that many of our Parishioners have opted to make their contributions by way of an electronic transfer. The Finance Committee would really appreciate it if those Parishioners who are not currently contributing or contributing by way of the Planned Giving Envelopes would consider contributing by way of an electronic transfer.

• As a result of changes brought about by COVID-19, we are asking that, where possible, all contributions to our Parish and Priests are made via an electronic funds transfer facility.

With the current closure of our Church, the needs of the Parish and the broader community continue. With COVID-19 not going away, the drain on our resources is even greater.

During this lockdown and the uncertainty of life after we start to open up again, we are asking you to consider ways in which you may help the Parish achieve a more consistent income (cash flow) to enable the Parish to continue providing income for our Priests and the ongoing Pastoral and Administrative Services for our Parish Community.

The "Tap N Go" system introduced last year after the Church was opened up after the initial lockdown in 2020, has certainly been successful in maintaining our income as demonstrated in the recent Financial Report. For that we are most grateful to those who have contributed using this method.

Unfortunately, the "Tap N Go" does not work if the Church is not open and people are not going to Mass.

Our request last year to Parishioners involved in the Envelope Planned Giving program was well received and resulted in many converting to electronic transfer instead of the old Envelope system. Once again this has helped maintain income and has been very much appreciated.

We encourage our Parishioners to convert to the Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) form of contribution in the two areas of support, one for the Parish needs and one for our Priests.

The Word Sunday 29 August 2021: 22nd Sunday of Ordinary Time

First Reading

From the book of Deuteronomy Dt 4:1-2. 6-8

You may add nothing to the word which I speak to you – keep the commands of the Lord.

Moses said to the people: 'Now, Israel, take notice of the laws and customs that I teach you today, and observe them, that you may have life and may enter and take possession of the land that the Lord the God of your fathers is giving you. You must add nothing to what I command you, and take nothing from it, but keep the commandments of the Lord your God just as I lay them down for you. Keep them, observe them, and they will demonstrate to the peoples your wisdom and understanding. When they come to know of all these laws they will exclaim, "No other people is as wise and prudent as this great nation." And indeed, what great nation is there that has its gods so near as the Lord our God is to us whenever we call to him? And what great nation is there that has laws and customs to match this whole Law that I put before you today?' The Word of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm PS 14:2-5. R. v.1

(R.) The just will live in the presence of the Lord.

- 1. Lord, who shall dwell on your holy mountain? He who walks without fault; he who acts with justice and speaks the truth from his heart. (*R*.)
- 2. He who does no wrong to his brother, who casts no slur on his neighbour, who holds the godless in disdain, but honours those who fear the Lord. (*R*.)

Second Reading

From the letter of St St James Jas 1:17-18, 21-22, 27

Be doers of the word.

It is all that is good, everything that is perfect, which is given us from above; it comes down from the Father of all light; with him there is no such thing as alteration, no shadow of a change. By his own choice he made us his children by the message of the truth so that we should be a sort of first-fruits of all that he had created.

Accept and submit to the word which has been planted in you and can save your souls. But you must do what the word tells you, and not just listen to it and deceive yourselves.

Pure, unspoilt religion, in the eyes of God our Father is this: coming to the help of orphans and widows when they need it, and keeping oneself uncontaminated by the world. The Word of the Lord.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 7:1-8. 14-15. 21-23

You forget the commandments of God and hold on to human tradition.

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service, while their hearts are far from me.

The worship they offer me is worthless,

the doctrines they teach are only human regulations. You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within and make a man unclean.' The Gospel of the Lord.
