Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The lamenting voice of Jeremiah in today's first reading reminds us that sometimes we experience aloneness, rejection, and even persecution for our faith. Living a life of faith can be a lonely road at times, especially when we are called to walk against the grain of popular views and aspirations. This uncomfortable reality is echoed in the Gospel as Jesus remonstrates with Peter. It is apparent that, despite walking closely with Jesus as a faithful disciple, Peter has not fully understood what radical discipleship means. It is imperative that Jesus remains faithful to his mission and confronts the reality of the cross and the inherent power of darkness. Our current 'creature comfort' culture can seduce us into avoiding pain and conflict. As committed disciples of Jesus we are called to embrace the cross so that, in companionship with Jesus alive in our Christian community, we can continue to heal the world from within.

looking for a way to serve God?

For the last 8 years we have been going into St Ives High School once a term, as a team, to teach scripture in a seminar style format. This was initiated because we didn't have enough students turning up to scripture weekly at that time. The students in the school are truly delightful and they want to engage with Jesus. We just need people to share their faith with the students. Over these years, we have built rapport with the students, with one student saying to me when she left, **"It's a shame we don't get scripture more often!"** This broke my heart and motivated me to see what we could do to change it.

Truthfully, this seminar approach is not enough. We need your help.

How can students get 45 minutes of scripture once a term, know Jesus and engage in relationship with Him, especially if they are not getting it from home? 45 minutes per term makes that goal near impossible.

We may have the opportunity to connect with the students on a weekly basis but I need a team of people to help. <u>There is a time</u> <u>limit on this</u>. The school principal is leaving in the next month and when I spoke to him, he was open to the possibility of us returning weekly. To leave it longer would mean we could miss the opportunity.

Each time I speak the word, I have to howl and proclaim: 'Violence and ruin!' The word of the Lord has meant for me insult, derision, all day long. I used to say, I will not think about him, I will not speak in his name any more. Then there seemed to be a fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones. The effort to restrain it wearied me, I could not bear it. The Word of the Lord.

# Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself.

Jesus began to make it clear to his disciples that he was destined to go to Jerusalem and suffer grievously at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, to be put to death and to be raised up on the third day. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. 'Heaven preserve you, Lord,' he said. 'This must not happen to you.' But he turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is not God's way but man's.' Then Jesus said to his disciples, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it. What, then, will a man gain if he wins the whole world and ruins his life? Or what has a man to offer in exchange for his life?
