Dear Parishioners

Today we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday. Jesus described himself as 'the good shepherd', the gateway to the sheepfold. To be a good leader is to imitate Jesus, the Good Shepherd. The qualities that made Jesus the Good Shepherd are the same qualities that characterise a worthy church leader, a pastor/priest, a teacher, a civil

servant, and a father/mother. A good shepherd:

- GATHERS AND PROTECTS: Jesus warns us about 'false' shepherds who are really wolves dressed in sheepskins. The good leader protects the flock from these dangerous adversaries.
- LISTENS: The good shepherd is willing to dialogue with the flock, practising 'synodality'- walking with them in the journey to the heavenly Kingdom.
- LEADS: The good shepherd never threatens or coerces by force; he leads by example and invites people to follow. That is why integrity and consistency are essential virtues for pastors. People tend to follow leaders whom they can trust.
- SACRIFICES on behalf on the sheep. A good shepherd genuinely cares for the flock and puts their well-being first. A good shepherd gives time and energy for them. A good shepherd is not greedy or bent on self-enrichment.
- FOLLOWS CHRIST THE GOOD SHEPHERD. A sure formula for being a good pastor/elder is to be able to say with St Paul, 'Imitate me as I imitate Christ' (1 Corinthians 1:11) and follow Peter's advice: 'Be the shepherds of the flock of God that is entrusted to you: watch over it, not simply as a duty but gladly, because God wants it' (1 Peter 5:2).

Social Justice Corner No More Just War?

For centuries, Catholic thinkers have espoused the doctrine of 'just war': a

limited set of circumstances in which war can be morally permissible. The doctrine is set out in paragraph 2309 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Today, however, ethicists are questioning whether those conditions can ever realistically be met, due to the destructive power of modern weapons and the impossibility of avoiding civilian deaths. Moreover, the paragraph on just war is preceded by paragraphs about safeguarding peace and avoiding war and is followed by paragraphs that go on to condemn the possession or use of weapons capable of indiscriminate destruction, the arms race and the arms industry generally.

How can we build peace? The Justice and Peace Office, Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney, is hosting a lively discussion around these issues with prominent speakers from public life and Catholic thinkers:



The Word

Sunday 30 April 2023, Fourth Sunday of Easter

Collect

Almighty ever-living God, lead us to a share in the joys of heaven, so that the humble flock may reach where the brave Shepherd has gone before. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

From the Acts of the Apostles Acts 2:14, 36-41

God has made Jesus both Lord and Christ. On the day of Pentecost Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed the crowd with a loud voice: 'The whole House of Israel can be certain that God has made this Jesus whom you crucified both Lord and Christ.'

Hearing this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the apostles, 'What must we do, brothers?' 'You must repent,' Peter answered 'and every one of you must be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise that was made is for you and your children, and for all those who are far away, for all those whom the Lord our God will call to himself.' He spoke to them for a long time using many arguments, and he urged them, 'Save yourselves from this perverse generation.' They were convinced by his arguments, and they accepted what he said and were baptised. That very day about three thousand were added to their number.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 22:1-6. R. v.1

(R.) The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

- 1. The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want. Fresh and green are the pastures where he gives me repose. Near restful waters he leads me, to revive my drooping spirit. (*R*.)
- 2. He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name. If I should walk in the valley of darkness no evil would I fear. You are there with your crook and your staff; with these you give me comfort. (*R*.)
- 3. You have prepared a banquet for me in the sight of my foes. My head you have anointed with oil; my cup is overflowing. (*R*.)
- 4. Surely goodness and kindness shall follow me all the days of my life. In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever and ever. (*R.*)

Second Reading

From the letter of St Peter 1 Pt 2:20-25

You had gone astray but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls. The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty. This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to John Jn 10:1-10

I am the gate of the sheepfold.

Jesus said: 'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.' Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them. So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'
