THERESE: HOLINESS FOR ALL

On Monday 1 October we celebrate the Feast of St Therese. Her approach appreciates the tenderness and compassion of God for all people and invites a response of living the Golden Rule of loving God in a way that embraces others in our ordinary everyday living. She only lived to 24 but Pius IX said she is one of the greatest saints of modern times. She is a doctor of the church and so that means eminent sanctity and eminent teaching acknowledged by the Church. What I find special about her is that she has a way of living the Gospel in ordinary everyday living. She did not do extraordinary penances; she did not receive extraordinary visions. She teaches us how even our imperfections may be used by God. We may profit in every circumstance. Do you want to find out how Therese helps us to live the Gospel and foster the Kingdom in ordinary everyday living: family life, workplace and leisure? How does Therese show us how to profit from every circumstance even with respect to our weaknesses and imperfections? St Therese relates very well to the ordinary Christian so she relates to the majority of Christians.

Well what is the way she wanted to teach souls? "It's the way of spiritual childhood: it's the way of confidence and total abandonment. I want to teach them the little means that have succeeded so perfectly with me to tell them that there is only one thing to do here on earth: to caste at Jesus the flowers of little sacrifices, to take Him by caresses: this is the way I have taken Him and it is for this I shall be received.

SOCIAL JUSTICE CORNER:



A Place to Call Home

Today we are celebrating Social Justice Sunday. The 2018 Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement is titled: "A Place to Call Home: Making a home for everyone in our land".

The latest Census figures show that more than 116,000 Australians are homeless, something unacceptable for a rich and well-resourced nation like ours. Yet these people are only the tip of the iceberg; welfare agencies report growing numbers of families and individuals struggling to meet the cost of mortgages or rents and turning to specialist housing services, which are often unable to meet demand. House prices and rents are spiralling out of reach of too many families and placing huge financial stress on ordinary people, even the employed. For those living on pensions or allowances, finding secure housing can be a far greater challenge, one that often takes a terrible toll on social wellbeing and mental health.

Social Justice Sunday 2018 reminds us that that safe and secure housing is a human right, asserted both by the Church's social teaching and by the Declaration of Human Rights. It is the inherent dignity of each brother and sister in need of a place to call home that urges us on to confront the growing challenge of homelessness and housing insecurity in Australia.
