Invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; blessed indeed will you be. (Gospel)

Dear parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

A wedding banquet is an ideal opportunity to strengthen bonds of friendship, family ties, and neighbourliness. Jesus is certainly not opposed to inviting friends and relatives on such occasions. What is to be avoided is selfishness which excludes less fortunate people and invites

only those who can 'pay back' the invitation in some way.

Jesus urges his audience to extend their hospitality to new groups: the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind. These are the people who are on the fringes of or outside the village community. People must go beyond the bounds of kinship and close alliance.

The kingdom is not reserved to a select few. God prepares his banquet for everyone: the just and the sinners, the good and the bad, the learned and the uneducated, those on the margins and those rejected and scorned by society.

In the end, the kingdom of heaven is the only banquet that counts. To miss out on that banquet is the greatest tragedy that can happen to anyone.

The people at the margins of society have a powerful patron: God. To include them in a table fellowship here on earth is to ensure oneself a place of honour in heaven.

Social Justice Corner

Social Justice Sunday

This weekend, our parish is proudly celebrating Social Justice Sunday. The celebration of Social Justice Sunday is a longstanding tradition in the Catholic

Church in Australia. Our bishops have come together nearly every year since 1940 to issue an important social justice statement. The theme of the 2025/2026 statement is *Signs of Hope on the Edge: Serving Homeless People with Mental III-Health.* Further information about this statement will be provided in next week's Social Justice Corner.

In 2024, our parish's Social Justice Group drafted a report titled *Taking Action for a Just Society*, summarising the social justice actions in our parish. This weekend, we are releasing a revised version incorporating input from parish members. The 2025 version identifies new social justice programs undertaken in our parish by many individuals, families, and groups.

We intend for the report to address a common statement: "If only the Catholic community of St Ives knew about all the different social justice initiatives that our parish coordinates." We hope the report raises awareness of the many wonderful social justice initiatives that support the core work carried out by our dedicated Carmelites as well as our acolytes, senior and junior servers, lectors, church wardens, communion ministers, catechists, and volunteers involved with the Children's Liturgy, Children's Sacramental Program, Altar Society, altar linen, music ministry, hospitality group, floral arrangers, and more.





First Reading

From the book of Ecclesiasticus Sir 3:17-20, 28-29

Humble yourself and you will find favour with the Lord.

My son, be gentle in carrying out your business, and you will be better loved than a lavish giver. The greater you are, the more you should behave humbly, and then you will find favour with the Lord; for great though the power of the Lord is, he accepts the homage of the humble. There is no cure for the proud man's malady, since an evil growth has taken root in him. The heart of a sensible man will reflect on parables, an attentive ear is the sage's dream.

Second Reading

What you have come to is nothing known to the senses: not a blazing fire, or a gloom turning to total darkness, or a storm; or trumpeting thunder or the great voice speaking which made everyone that heard it beg that no more should be said to them. But what you have come to is Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem where the millions of angels have gathered for the festival, with the whole Church in which everyone is a 'first-born son' and a citizen of heaven. You have come to God himself, the supreme Judge, and been placed with spirits of the saints who have been made perfect; and to Jesus, the mediator who brings a new covenant.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 14:1. 7-14

All who exalt themselves shall be humbled and all who humble themselves shall be exalted.

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there. so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
