Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son. (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Can you recall a moment or event that marked a dramatic change in how your life unfolded thereafter? Your story took a critical turn. Something important changed forever. What was, was no longer.

Today's readings speak of such a threshold moment. When the Israelites enter the promised land, the *manna* stops falling; they are now fed from the produce of the Land itself. For St Paul, to embrace the life of Christ is so utterly transformative that he speaks of becoming a "new creation". In the Gospel of the prodigal son, Jesus describes the Father's love as an experience of over-the-top forgiveness and radical reconciliation; a movement from death to life, from being 'lost' to being 'found'.

In the light of these readings, consider where 'newness' is breaking into your life at this time. What and who is being changed? Can you trace the footprints of grace in the experience?

Corpus Christi Important Church Aims and Happenings

Our Parish Pastoral Council has three main aims:

1) Plenary Council:

Listening and Dialogue Sessions have now ceased and the second stage of discernment with the Plenary is underway.

2) Development of Youth:

Much has been done in the background. Also last week we had a full church at our 6pm Family Mass on Sunday. Complete with drums, guitars, young people singing and playing musical instruments. There was very good feedback from people coming out of the church. The children were active in all parts of the Mass. There was a beautiful liturgical dance performed by the students of Corpus Christi School. The Family Mass will occur twice in each school term. There will be a meeting of interested persons organised in the near future to further develop our youth ministry.

3) Missionary Disciples

We aim to grow as misionary disciples of Christ. In the near future there will be opportunities for us to enrich our lives and the lives of others as we develop our friendship with Jesus – Alpha is one way of achieving this.

It is possible for each of us to have a personal relationship with Jesus to assist us on our journey and help achieve our goals and build community.

What is Alpha?

Alpha is a series of interactive sessions exploring our faith. There are three elements to an Alpha session. Firstly, there is a meal, during which people enjoy each others company. Secondly, there is a presentation of an element of the Gospel message in a way that can deepen our meaning for living. Thirdly, there is a discussion in a small group in a non-confrontational way, but in a way that allows each person to be himself or herself. It is fun and encourages a culture of invitation. Alpha is not just a program but has a vision for church renewal.

For the last three decades, Popes have called us to a new evangelisation. Unfortunately our churches are maintenance orientated and have lost the art of evanglising. By evangelisation we are reaching out to others in an invitational way. Alpha helps us to achieve this aim. Catechists are presently doing this in state schools.

Alpha gives us an opportunity to deepen our relationship with the Lord and to share it with others. We will be running Alpha within our parish commencing Tuesday, 14 May 2019.

Sunday 31 March 2019: Fourth Sunday Lent - (Corpus Christi) - Year C

First Reading

From the book of Joshua Jos 5:9-12

The people of God went to the promised land and there kept the passover.

The Lord said to Joshua, 'Today I have taken the shame of Egypt away from you.' The Israelites pitched their camp at Gilgal and kept the Passover there on the fourteenth day of the month, at evening in the plain of Jericho. On the morrow of the Passover they tasted the produce of that country, unleavened bread and roasted ears of corn, that same day. From that time, from their first eating of the produce of that country, the manna stopped falling. And having manna no longer, the Israelites fed from that year onwards on what the land of Canaan yielded. The Word of the Lord.

It was God who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the work of handing on his reconciliation. In other words, God in Christ was reconciling the world to himself, not holding men's faults against them, and he has entrusted to us the news that they are reconciled. So we are ambassadors for Christ; it is as though God were appealing through us, and the appeal that we make in Christ's name is: be reconciled to God. For our sake God made the sinless one into sin, so that in him we might become the goodness of God.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 15:1-3. 11-32

Your brother here was dead and has come to life. The tax collectors and the sinners were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and the scribes complained. 'This man' they said 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them: 'A man had two sons. The younger said to his father, "Father, let me have the share of the estate that would come to me." So the father divided the property between them. A few days later, the younger son got together everything he had and left for a distant country where he squandered his money on a life of debauchery. 'When he had spent it all, that country experienced a severe famine, and now he began to feel the pinch, so he hired himself out to one of the local inhabitants who put him on his farm to feed the pigs. And he would willingly have filled his belly with the husks the pigs were eating but no one offered him anything. Then he came to his senses and said, "How many of my father's paid servants have more food than they want, and here am I dying of hunger! I will leave this place and go to my father and say: Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as one of your paid servants." So he left the place and went back to his father. 'While he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was moved with pity. He ran to the boy, clasped him in his arms and kissed him tenderly. Then his son said, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son." But the father said to his servants. "Quick! Bring out the best robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Bring the calf we have been fattening, and kill it; we are going to have a feast, a celebration, because this son of mine was dead and has come back to life; he was lost and is found." And they began to celebrate. 'Now the elder son was out in the fields, and on his way back, as he drew near the house, he could hear music and dancing. Calling one of the servants he asked what it was all about. "Your brother has come" replied the servant "and your father has killed the calf we had fattened because he has got him back safe and sound." He was angry then and refused to go in, and his father came out to plead with him; but he answered his father, "Look, all these years I have slaved for you and never once disobeyed your orders, yet you never offered me so much as a kid for me to celebrate with my friends. But for this son of yours, when he comes back after swallowing up your property - he and his women - you kill the calf we had been fattening." 'The father said, "My son, you are with me always and all I have is yours. But it is only right we should celebrate and rejoice, because your brother here was dead and has come to life; he was lost and is found." The Gospel of the Lord.
