Dear Parishioners,

Today, the second Sunday of Advent, we meet John the Baptist. Note the details in the Gospel reading: John the Baptist 'went throughout the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance...' The word in the original Greek that is often translated as

repentance is 'metanoia' literally meaning 'change of heart'. One commentary adds that this kind of repentance is not about regret or guilt or shame but implies making a decision to turn around to face a new direction. When we face away from the light, all we can see is our own shadow. When we turn towards the light our shadow and the darkness are behind us. Repentance means not only turning from what is bad, but also from many things that are good, but not just for us at this time, or turning from good things to which we have become inordinately attached and which, therefore, restrict our ability to be truly free.

Every year before Christmas the children are asked to write a letter to the Angel of Christmas, asking for a Christmas gift. With help of kind hearted people from all over the world, most of the wishes are delivered, on Christmas Eve to the children in the orphanage.

A 9 year old girls request was unusual for the caregiver. She asked for a pair of shoes 2 sizes smaller than her feet. The caregiver was puzzled, she carefully asked her why is she asking for shoes, as her shoes were still in good condition. And why does she want shoes smaller than her feet. The little girl became tearful and hesitant to answer back. The caregiver reassured her that she is not in any trouble for

her Christmas wish, but she just want to be sure about her

So the sweet little girl explained: "there is a girl in my class who tries to sit close to the heater every day, with her feet against it. I asked her why she does that? She said to me that the soles of her shoes are cracked and her feet get wet every day by the time she walks to school.

Here mum doesn't have any money to by a new pair for her. That's why I asked the Christmas Angel for a new pair of shoes for her."

This little girls example is in my heart ever since than, and will be forever.

What Is The Uluru Statement From The Heart?

The Statement was released in 2017, after the 16 member Referendum Council travelled around the country meeting with over 1,200 representing approximately 800,000 indigenous people. It calls for a First Nations voice in the Constitution and process of truth telling 'agreement-making'. It is an invitation to all Australians to come together in this process.


Why Is A Discussion Needed?

The Word

Sunday 5 December 2021 2nd Sunday in Advent

First Reading

A reading from the prophet Baruch Bar 5:1-9

Jerusalem – God will show you splendour. Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress.

put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness'.

Arise, Jerusalem, stand on the heights and turn your eyes to the east: see your sons reassembled from west and east at the command of the Holy One, jubilant that God has remembered them.

Though they left you on foot, with enemies for an escort, now God brings them back to you like royal princes carried back in glory. For God has decreed the flattening of each high mountain, of the everlasting hills, the filling of the valleys to make the ground level so that Israel can walk in safety under the glory of God. And the forests and every fragrant tree will provide shade for Israel at the command of God; for God will guide Israel in joy by the light of his glory with his mercy and integrity for escort. Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to Luke Lk 3:1-6

All people shall see the salvation of God. In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness;
Prepare a way for the Lord,
make his paths straight.
Every valley will be filled in,
every mountain and hill be laid low,
winding ways will be straightened
and rough roads made smooth.
And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.
