Dear Parishioners

What is the Transfiguration? What is happening on the mountain? Why did Jesus take the three disciples with him? These are important questions because without them we might misunderstand the event. St Luke tells us that they went up to the mountain to pray. If we read Matthew this way, the passage takes us into the prayer of Jesus. The disciples are privy to Jesus in his relationship with his Father. Have you seen someone absorbed in prayer? It can be an unforgettable experience of the beauty of a person in love with God; they person is changed. A person at one with God is most attractive to meet. This is the power of holiness alive. The disciples are overwhelmed by seeing Jesus in this relationship with his Father. Peter asks that they might stay here always. Oh to remain in the presence of God! Prayer also challenges us and helps us in our present needs. Before ascending the mountain, Jesus and his disciples struggled with is pending passion and death. The climax of the Transfiguration is the Father affirming his love for the Son and what will take place in Jerusalem. Jesus descends the mountain consoled by his Father and the disciples will walk to Jerusalem with Jesus. May God bless you, Fr Greg Chee, OCD

#### World Day of Social Justice

On February 20th, World Day of Social Justice was observed. This year's theme is "Overcoming Barriers and Unleashing Opportunities for Social Justice", highlighting the need to identify and remove obstacles that prevent people from achieving social justice, and to create opportunities for all individuals to participate fully in society.

World Social Justice Day provides an opportunity to highlight the importance of collaboration and collective action. It calls on individuals, communities, and governments to work together to address systemic issues and create a more equitable and inclusive society. By overcoming barriers and unleashing opportunities for social justice, we can create a brighter future for all people

The theme is particularly relevant given the challenges faced by many people during the COVID-19 pandemic, such as job loss, social isolation, and health disparities. It recognizes the need to address these barriers and create new opportunities for social justice in the post-pandemic world.

One of the key challenges facing social justice today is the erosion of trust in government and our institutions. A growing number of people no longer believe that their governments are acting in their best interests, and this has led to a growing sense of frustration and disillusionment. This lack of trust is particularly evident in the developing world, where corruption and political instability continue to be major issues.

Conversely, opportunities here in Australia such as the referendum for a First Nations Voice to Parliament present an opportunity to bring us together, strengthen the social contract, open pathways for healing, and create a fairer society. # The Word

## Sunday 5 March 2023, 2nd Sunday in Lent

### Collect

O God, you have commanded us to listen to your beloved Son, be pleased, we pray, to nourish us inwardly by your word, that, with spiritual sight made pure, we may rejoice to behold your glory. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, you Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

### **First Reading**

From the book of Genesis Gen 12:1-4

The call of Abraham, the father of God's people. The Lord said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your family and your father's house, for the land I will show you. I will make you a great nation; I will bless you and make your name so famous that it will be used as a blessing.

'I will bless those who bless you: I will curse those who slight you. All the tribes of the earth shall bless themselves by you.' So Abram went as the Lord told him. The Word of the Lord.

### Responsorial Psalm Ps 32:4-5. 18-20. 22. R. v.22

(R.) Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

From the holy Gospel according to Matthew Mt 17:1-9

#### His face shone like the sun.

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.' The Gospel of the Lord.
