Parents wishing to enrol their child for the Sacrament of Confirmation should do so by using the try booking link https://www.trybooking.com/CQNQV




The presentation of candidates will be held at the weekend masses on the 25th and 26th May.

An Evening with Emeritus Prof John Maynard

The Northern Sydney Alliance for the Uluru Statement is hosting an event on Tuesday, 21 May 2024 with Emeritus Prof John Maynard who will be speaking on his book, Fight for Liberty and Freedom: 100 Years of Aboriginal Activism.

Members of the Northern Sydney Alliance come from a range of backgrounds and organisations and share one goal: to work towards justice for First Nations people of this land and towards greater understanding and respect for all Australians.

Prof John Maynard is a Worimi man and Emeritus Professor of History at the University of Newcastle. Author of many books and former Deputy Chair of the Australian Institute of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies, his research has examined the rise of early Aboriginal political activism. He is credited with unearthing the links between early African-American and Aboriginal politics. His grandfather was Fred Maynard, the noted political activist and President of the 1924 Australian Aboriginal Progressive Association.



My Pilgrimage into the Catholic Faith - Aidan O'Neill



I've been a Christian most of my life, being brought up in a Pentecostal church. While I was surrounded by that influence growing up, and absorbed the teachings and beliefs, I felt that it never really

connected to me. It wasn't until the past 2 years that I chose to gradually immerse myself back into the faith, but through a Catholic lens.

In early 2023, I was encouraged to attend the World Youth Day in Lisbon by a relative. In an admittedly unresearched decision I decided to walk the Portuguese Camino. I spent 6 weeks walking from Lisbon to Santiago, meeting a wide range of people along the way. I studied the Gospel of Luke, admired the 'Landscape Temple' of God's creation and overall immersed myself in the pilgrim culture. I continued this solitary reflection until I reached Santiago, where I began the second part of my conversion; Two weeks involved with an American group during W.Y.D.

While my Catholic pilgrimage started on my own, it ended with community. I was welcomed into the American group as one of their own and got heavily inspired by their faith. Their strong sense of community and passion for faith was what ultimately led me to seek out the RCIA upon returning back to Sydney.

I am continuing my work in Horticulture and pursuing further learning in the Catholic Faith.

PRESBYTERY UPDATE

Dear Parishioners

As indicated in the last update (17 March 2024) the project will now be done in two phases. The plan for the renovation of the presbytery is complete and tenders for this first part of the project will be called for as soon as the tender documentation is complete. We anticipate that tenders will be called for in the next month. Once tenders are received and we have a firm idea on the costs of the renovation we will meet with the Diocese to obtain their formal approval to commence the renovations. At this stage we only have an informal approval from the Diocese. If any parishioner knows of a builder that would like to tender could they please contact the parish office with the details.

Based on the cost estimates, we have sufficient funds to go ahead with the renovations, thanks to the generosity of our parishioners.

It is anticipated that the renovations could be completed within a three to four month period after the tender is awarded. This means that our priests should be able to move into the renovated presbytery prior to December 2024 when the lease on their current accommodation expires.

Temporary arrangements for the office staff will be made during the construction period.

The plans for the new office building are being completed as well as the documents required to lodge a DA with Council. We are hoping to be able to lodge a DA towards the end of May. Once we lodge the DA we will also need to obtain formal approval from the Diocese for the building. We will also have to apply for a loan from the CDF. At this stage we do not have sufficient funds to complete the office building so our fund-raising efforts will continue. Thank you for your generosity.



The Word

Sunday 5 May 2024: Sixth Sunday of Easter

Collect

Grant, almighty God,

that we may celebrate with heartfelt devotion these days of joy,

which we keep in honour of the risen Lord, and that what we relive in remembrance we may always hold to in what we do.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,

God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

From the Acts of the Apostles Acts 10:25-26. 34-35. 44-48

The gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the gentiles also.

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said, 'I am only a man after all!'

Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.
