Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

Today we recount how the Israelites revolted against Moses and despised God because of their hunger for physical food. They quickly forgot all the great things that God had done for them. God, however, proved to be a great provider by feeding them with manna from heaven. In the Gospel, Jesus performs the miracle of the multiplication of bread and fish out of necessity. However, the crowd has been taken up only by the material things they could get from Christ. So, rather than first accepting Christ and the word of

God he preached, they allowed physical hunger to overshadow their spiritual hunger. When we pay too much of attention to material things, we tend to forget the goodness of God in the past. So, rather than counting our blessings we might end up counting our woes, and blaming God for our misfortunes.

National Vocations Awareness Week begins 5th August 2018 and provides an opportunity for all parishes and schools to focus at the same time on the 'call to holiness' that arises from our Baptism and thus to further foster a Vocation's Culture across Australia. In this Year of Youth may our prayers and support assist them to discern God's plan and call for their life.

### **LISTEN TO POPE FRANCIS**

Pope Francis wrote a lovely apostolic exhortation on the 19<sup>th</sup> of March 2018, the Feast of St Joseph. It is called Gaudete et Exsultate which means rejoice and be glad. They are the first words of his beautiful exhortation.

Essentially, the whole exhortation is about holiness for all. I simply want to give you a taste of the first chapter. What is holiness? Essentially it is the full flowering of love. So when parents raise children with great love and work hard to support the family, that is holiness. Hence there are not only saints in heaven but also saints next door.

Who does the Lord call to holiness? Essentially it is everyone. Vatican II says, "All the faithful whatever their condition or state are called by the Lord — each in his own way — to that perfect holiness by which the Father himself is perfect." Our living of mature love in all walks of life must have a positive impact in the world in a way that has eternal implications not only for ourself but for others. St John of the Cross says, "In the eventide of life we will be examined in love."

In the quote above from Vatican II, I like the part where it says all are called to holiness — 'each in his own way' because it allows expressions of mature love in many ways. So, individually we need to ask 'Who is Christ and we for each other.' What aspects of Jesus' life am I called to reflect in my daily encounters with others? There is a need to be sensitive to what God willed for each of us from all eternity. Mary was called to be the Mother of God, John the Baptist was called to prepare the way of the Lord, and Jeremiah was called to be a prophet to the nations. So, what has God called you to be?

What is your mission in Christ? Is it related to holiness? Do I have a mission or is my identity my mission? My mission is to be a Carmelite priest in a community of four in Australia in St Ives as a parish priest expressing the Golden Rule which is the Gospel. My mission will be linked with my particular identity in Christ. I don't have a mission. I am a mission. My mission and holiness will be linked with certain aspects of the richness in Christ. So what is your mission? How do you understand it? We must model our life on Christ coming to glorify the Father.

As one lives one's mission which is inextricably linked with loving God in a way that is committed to his project of loving others we will have a positive impact on the world, grow in holiness and simultaneously gain eternal life. In living holiness in the above sense we are more alive and more human. St Teresa said 'beware of sour face saints.' Holiness is authentic living. Here one encounters one's weakness with the power of God's grace. The only great tragedy is not to become a saint.
