**A voice of one crying out in the desert:
“Prepare the way of the Lord.”**

(First Reading)

Dear Parishioners,

Spiritual writers speak of the journey that we must make to God. The point is valid but there is a danger that we may think that God is stationary somewhere and we must journey to him, that it's all up to us. No, our relationship with God is far more dynamic and God is always journeying towards us, searching for us, calling out to us by name as he did with Adam and Eve in the garden. The season of Advent prepares us to celebrate God's coming to us as a babe at Bethlehem and encourages us to look forward to Christ's final coming in glory. What we are called to do is to 'prepare a way for the Lord' to come to us. And what is that way? Well, today's responsorial psalm says that 'justice shall march before him'. To prepare the way, we need to act with justice and promote justice, both in our personal lives and globally. Today's first reading captures beautifully the longing of God to be united with us: 'He is like a shepherd leading his flock, gathering the lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast, and leading to their rest the mother ewes.' (Isa 40:11) For a few moments imagine yourself being held in the loving arms of God and leaning against his breast. That is the kind of intimacy God desires with us. We pray: 'Lord help us to prepare a way for you to come to us. Help us to remove any barriers we create, whether consciously or unconsciously, that keeps us from your loving embrace.'

Appeal for Actions on West Papua

The Catholic Justice & Peace Commission of the Archdiocese of Brisbane has urged the Australian Government to put greater pressure on the Indonesian Government over continuing violence and arrests of Indigenous people in West Papua. The call follows the arrest of over 50 Papuans attending a meeting to evaluate the special autonomy program and funding for West Papua on the 17th November in the Papuan city of Merauke. Over 50 Papuan Catholic priests have issued public statements in recent months expressing concerns about racism towards Indigenous Papuans, the continuing build-up of Indonesian security forces in West Papua and the ensuing violence and the special autonomy program and funding in West Papua which has been in place for 20 years and is widely rejected.



The Word

Sunday 6 December 2020: Second Sunday of Advent

First Reading

A reading from the prophet Isaiah Is 40:1-5. 9-11

Prepare the way for the Lord.

'Console my people, console them' says your God.

'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 84:9-14. R. v.8

(R.) Lord, let us see your kindness, and grant us your salvation.

1. I will hear what the Lord God has to say, a voice that speaks of peace, peace for his people. His help is near for those who fear him and his glory will dwell in our land. *(R.)*
2. Mercy and faithfulness have met; justice and peace have embraced. Faithfulness shall spring from the earth and justice look down from heaven. *(R.)*
3. The Lord will make us prosper and our earth shall yield its fruit. Justice shall march before him and peace shall follow his steps. *(R.)*

Second Reading

A reading from first letter of St Peter 2 Pt 3:8-14

We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up. Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised: the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will be at home. So then, my friends, while you are waiting, do your best to live lives without spot or stain so that he will find you at peace.

From the holy Gospel according to Mark Mk 1:1-8

Make straight the paths of the Lord.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way.

A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord,

make his paths straight,

and so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'
