

The devil said to him, “If you are the son of God, command this stone to become bread.” (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners,

Later in our Eucharistic celebration we will pray, ‘Father... lead us not into temptation.’ It is a plea that our loving God will strengthen and support us in the trials that inevitably confront us in our efforts to live faithful lives in accordance with God’s will for his creation. In this, as in all matters related to our spiritual growth, Jesus, who was ‘tempted in every way that we are, though he is without sin’ (Hebrews 4:15), is our exemplar. ‘Learn from me,’ he says, ‘and you will find rest for your souls’ (Matthew 11:29-30). The dramatic account of Jesus’ encounter with Satan (the adversary) occurs in all three Synoptic Gospels. It is an appropriate reading with which to introduce the penitential season of Lent. The temptations that Jesus faced at the beginning of his public ministry relate to three issues that lie at the heart of the discord and division that bedevil contemporary society—our self-centred attitudes to power, property and prestige—an unholy trinity that claims the worship of so many people. The ominous words which conclude today’s reading are a reminder that the tempter is still destructively active among us and that should be on our guard.

FINANCE UPDATE – SIX MONTHS TO 31 DECEMBER 2021

Dear Parishioners

THANK YOU FOR YOUR GENEROSITY IN TIME, TALENT AND TREASURE

This last six months has been challenging for all of us. The on and off restrictions and the Omicron wave has been quite stressful and has had an effect on our church. Our attendances at Mass are understandably down with the consequent effect of lower collections. We are grateful to those parishioners who continue to support both the parish and our priests with their contributions. The assistance we received from the NSW government certainly helped to reduce our deficit. We are pleased to report that our roof loan is now fully paid off. Our expenses are under control and we continue to closely monitor them.

We encourage parishioners who haven't yet joined the planned giving to participate by way of a direct debit or credit card. If you haven't yet but would like to contribute by direct debit or credit card please either call the Parish Office (9144 6998) or complete the attached **form** and return it to the office or drop it in the second collection bag at the front of the church.

Parishioners will know that Murphy House is now sold and no longer owned by the Diocese. However, the Diocese has entered into a lease agreement with the new owners to allow our priests to remain there until October 2023. This gives us the chance to plan and build a new presbytery. To this end a subcommittee has been formed and has explored a number of options for a new presbytery. At this early stage some preliminary plans have been drawn for a new building alongside the parish office. The subcommittee has recommended that the parish office be renovated at the same time to cater for the longer term needs of the parish as outlined by the parish pastoral council. A full briefing will be given to parishioners to allow questions and comments. The date for the briefing has not yet been set but should be within the next month or so. Parishioners will be given adequate notice of when the briefing will be.

We thank all parishioners for their continued support as we all work together during these difficult times to enhance our Parish.

NATIONAL CHURCH LIFE SURVEY- 5 & 6 MARCH

Our parish has been selected to participate in the National Church Life Survey on behalf of our Diocese which gives useful information for planning in the context of the whole of Australia. It is also an opportunity to hear what people are really thinking whether they come to Church or not. We would be then in a better position to serve and care for them. We will receive our own parish report with survey results which we could share with you. The results would give us a basis for planning a positive future for those we serve. Please see below for some other reasons to participate.

Churches of all sizes and traditions, in urban, rural and remote communities, complete a *Church Life Survey*, as a way to reflect on their church's health and vitality.

'Life to the full' is the underlying philosophy as the survey aims to be a life-giving resource for churches, to nurture their vitality and inform their decision making, as they seek to be part of God's mission where they are.

1. Hear all the voices - take time to listen Hear the attitudes and beliefs of all people at church, including those who don't always get heard: ministers, lay leaders, adult attenders, youth and children, at one time, in a season of listening.

2. Make better choices: Use a credible evidence base to inform your discussions and decisions. Discern where best to place your energy and direction, based on your survey feedback.

3. Find out things you need to know: As mission researchers, the NCLS team know things about what you care about. Doing a nation-wide survey helps churches to learn from each other and allows leaders to identify key trends.

4. Find out the giftings and hopes of attenders : Receive a list of areas where your attenders are gifted and motivated to act. Harness their energy, motivation and hopes to move forward. Encourage all to contribute their gifts and skills.

5. Take stock of your church's health : Beyond counting heads, use the NCLS Research framework of church vitality to assess nine core qualities and three attendance measures, at regular times in your church's journey.

6. Identify your strengths and use them to grow: Survey results will show where your church's strengths lie. Identify your strengths and use them to inform areas of growth. Our planning resources are strengths-based, the best place to start when making any change.

First Reading

From the book of Deuteronomy Dt 26:4-10

The confession of faith of the elect.

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement: "My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus was led by the Spirit through the wilderness where he was tempted.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.'

Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.' Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God', he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you, and again:

They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.' But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.' Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.
