

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish.

When Jesus tells us: 'Love one another as I have loved you', what type of love has Jesus in mind? It is not love of pleasure, attraction or satisfaction. Nor is it only love of benevolence that focuses not on the one who loves but on the loved.

What Jesus intends is transcendental love that freely gives all that one is and one has to the one

who is loved. This is the highest form of love with which Jesus loved us. God is the focus of this level of love. In transcendental love, human love is not absorbed or suppressed, but illumined by the love of God.

This is Christian love, the love which Jesus proposes to his followers. Here the one who loves may even sacrifice one's own happiness if the good of the *loved* is at stake. In doing so, the one who loves elevates love to the level of virtue: a love which is selfsacrificing-CHRISTIAN LOVE.

ABORTION ON DEMAND PUSH IN IRELAND

There will be a referendum on the repeal of the 8th Amendment of the Constitution which was inserted there in 1983, to defend the right of light of the 'unborn'. The referendum takes place in a month's time on Friday 25th May 2018. The Church is, as you would expect, unanimously and strongly against, however the voice of the hierarchy has lost is influence due to strong anticlerical movements in Ireland and the effects of the abuse scandals and their aftermath.

Let us pray that God's will may prevail in respecting the unborn life as a precious reality to be protected.

Did you know..... The Big Bang Theory came about from a Catholic priest? In the last few days, I went along to two presentations by Brother Guy Consolmagno which were held on Saturday 28 April and Monday night 30 April at Waitara and Tuggerah. Br Guy is the Director of the Vatican Observatory who holds a PhD in Planetary Science, written a number of books and has a plethora of other achievements under his belt. As both a Jesuit and a scientist, Br Guy explored the fascinating topic of how faith and science co-exist. This was both informative and exciting. For me, it really brought to the forefront of my mind how amazing our God really is. We know this, however, until it is put right in front of you in this manner, do we really appreciate it. Many children in the classroom will say things like "I don't believe in God, I believe in the Big Bang." It is not an either/or reality as many children believe it to be. They seem to think you have to believe in God or a Big Bang it can't be both. They don't understand God created the Big Bang!!

ST. JOSEPH THE WORKER

Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of St.Joseph the Worker in 1955. The Feast Day on 1st May is an opportunity to reflect on the true dignity and value of work and its place in our family and community life. St. Joseph, foster father to Jesus and a humble carpenter, is an important example of the holiness of human labour. St. Joseph is the Patron Saint of workers and of social justice.

In his encyclical Laborem Exercens (On Human Work), Pope John Paul II reminds us of the sacred and deeply human nature of work and the role of the Church in calling "attention to the dignity and rights of those who work, to condemn situations in which that dignity and those rights are violated, and to help to guide [social] changes as to ensure authentic progress by man and society."

SYDNEY PEACE PRIZE AWARD TO PROFESSOR JOSEPH STIGLITZ

Professor Joseph Stiglitz, American economist, Nobel laureate and lifelong champion for global economic justice, has been awarded the 2018 Sydney Peace Prize. Professor Stiglitz is a former senior vice president and chief economist of the World Bank and is a former member and chairman of the US president's Council of Economic Advisers. He has also been a member of the Pontifical Academy for Social Sciences.
