"Do not be unbelieving but believe." (Gospel)

Dear Parishioners and visitors to the Parish,

The Gospel of the second Sunday of Easter (John 20:19-31) is that of Jesus's appearance to the apostles locked in the upper room. "*Peace be*

with you," Jesus says as his disciples rejoice in the sight of their living God. Jesus breathed on them and said: "*Receive the Holy Spirit, whose sins you shall forgive they are forgiven them, whose sins you shall retain they are retained.*" This is the scriptural basis for the sacrament of reconciliation, one of the principle means of the bestowal of God's mercy and healing applying the benefits of Christ's passion, death and resurrection to repentant sinners.

Francis de Sales recommends that we make a humble, devout confession once a month if possible. In confession, you not only receive absolution from the sins you confess but also great strength to avoid them in the future, light to see them clearly and abundant grace to repair whatever damage you have incurred. You will practice the virtues of humility, obedience, simplicity and charity. However small the sins you confess may be, always have a sincere sorrow for them together with a firm resolution to correct them in the future.

The Sunday of Divine Mercy derives from the revelations given to St Faustina who died in 1938 and was canonised by John Paul II in the year 2000.


St Faustina received these revelations and mystical experiences towards the end of her life. During these revelations, our Lord asked her to promote the celebration of Divine Mercy on the second Sunday of Easter in the context of the great act of God's mercy flowing from the Christian Passover. Here is a strong connection between the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our redemption, which we solemnly acknowledged during Holy Week and Easter Sunday and God's merciful love as given by St Faustina and other saints such as St Therese.

The Eucharist makes present that Paschal mystery in a sacramental way when we come with proper dispositions in Holy Mass. The Lord said: "I desire that the Feast of Divine Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, especially for poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of my tender Mercy are open, pour out an ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fountain of Mercy.

Besides the feast day on the first Sunday after Easter there are other beautiful aspects of the devotion such as the Divine Mercy image, the chaplet, the 30'clock prayer and spreading the message of God's wonderful mercy.

Let us have great confidence in God's mercy and show mercy to others through the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. We are invited to experience God's mercy and forgiveness in the sacrament of reconciliation and in other ways and we in turn ought to forgive and be merciful to others and so break the spiral of violence with the miracle of forgiveness.




Welcome To Our Newest Members

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The Word Sunday 7 April 2024: Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Collect

God of everlasting mercy, who in the very recurrence of the paschal feast kindle the faith of the people you have made your own, increase, we pray, the grace you have bestowed, that all may grasp and rightly understand in what font they have been washed, by whose Spirit they have been reborn, by whose Blood they have been redeemed.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

First Reading

From the Acts of the Apostles Acts 4:32-35

The whole group was united, heart and soul. The whole group of believers was united, heart and soul; no one claimed for his own use anything that he had, as everything they owned was held in common.

The apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus with great power, and they were all given great respect. None of their members was ever in want, as all those who owned land or houses would sell them, and bring the money from them, to present it to the apostles; it was then distributed to any members who might be in need.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 117:2-4. 15-18. 22-24. R. v.1

(*R*.) Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting

- 1. Let the sons of Israel say: 'His love has no end.' Let the sons of Aaron say: 'His love has no end.' Let those who fear the Lord say: 'His love has no end.' (*R*.)
- 2. The Lord's right hand has triumphed; his right hand raised me up. I shall not die, I shall live and recount his deeds. I was punished, I was punished by the Lord, but not doomed to die. (*R*.)
- 3. The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone. This is the work of the Lord, a marvel in our eyes. This day was made by the Lord; we rejoice and are glad. (*R.*)

Second Reading

From the first letter of St John 1 Jn 5:1-6

Anyone begotten by God has already overcome the world.

Whoever believes that Jesus is the Christ has been begotten by God;

and whoever loves the Father that begot him loves the child whom he begets.

We can be sure that we love God's children if we love God himself and do what he has commanded us; this is what loving God is – keeping his commandments; and his commandments are not difficult, because anyone who has been begotten by God has already overcome the world; this is the victory over the world – our faith. Who can overcome the world? Only the man who believes that Jesus is the Son of God; Jesus Christ who came by water and blood, not with water only, but with water and blood; with the Spirit as another witness – since the Spirit is the truth.

Gospel

From the holy Gospel according to John Jn 20:19-31

After eight days, Jesus came in and stood among them.

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive,

they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain,

they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and can put my finger into the holes they made, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him:

'You believe because you can see me.

Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' There were many other signs that Jesus worked and the disciples saw, but they are not recorded in this book. These are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name.
