Dear Parishioners

Like the nine lepers who didn't think it necessary to thank Jesus for the healing received, many of us take for granted our innumerable everyday blessings! We seem to move about with a sense of entitlement convinced we are deserving of the blessings received. True happiness lies not in what we receive, but in how we receive. As is evident from Jesus' commendation, 'your faith has saved you', the thankful Samaritan had understood the full meaning of what he had experienced. St Ignatius of Loyola says, 'Gratitude is an attitude that keeps us aware of how we are blessed and who it is that blesses us.' No doubt, all ten lepers had cried out in faith, 'Jesus, Master, take pity on us'. But only one felt inclined to show gratitude. When in trouble or pain we, like the lepers, desperately seek God and when help does come, be it through family, neighbour or friend, do we bother to thank God or that person? Or do we simply take it for granted, saying, 'Oh! He or she was just doing their duty'. Today let us take the time to recall gratefully ten miracles God has wrought in our lives! *Lord, let your touch warm us and heal us.*

FATHER CHRIS RILEY’S YOUTH OFF THE STREETS

I am currently recruiting additional people for our food roster for Father Chris Riley’s Youth off the Street’s Don Bosco House, in Marrickville. Families from the Corpus Christi community have been supporting the house in Marrickville for the last 20 years. There are approximately 20 families/people who provide a frozen home cooked meal in a tinfoil container (Glad tuckaway box 20x18x5cm), once a month, which is collected by one of the volunteers at their home, in the St Ives area, on a Sunday morning. They are then taken by the designated volunteer, that afternoon, in eskies to Don Bosco in Marrickville. We only need, at the moment, people who can provide the frozen meal not the delivery to Marrickville.

First Reading

A reading from the second book of the Kings 2
Kgs 5:14-17

Naaman returned to Elisha, the prophet, and acknowledged the Lord.

Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child.

Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said, 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.'

Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

If we hold firm, we shall reign with Christ.

Remember the Good News that I carry. 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung from the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to being chained like a criminal – but they cannot chain up God's news. So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it.
