While Peter was speaking these things, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the word. (First Reading)

Dear Parishioners,

Peter's visit to Caesarea, the centre of Roman authority in Palestine, and his encounter with the centurion Cornelius marks a turning point in Luke's story of the mission of the early Church. The gift of baptism and participation in the Christian community can no longer be limited to the Jewish-Christians. Peter points out that God has made this clear. Before the administration of baptism, the Spirit had already descended upon the gathering. Rightly has this episode been called 'the Pentecost of the Gentiles'.

The Gospel reading picks up from last Sunday, continuing the theme of 'remaining', describing the nature of the relationship between the believer and Jesus as a relationship of love. A chain of love runs from the Father to the Son, and from the Son to the believer, but only if the believer keeps the commandments of Jesus. The centrepiece of John 15:1-16:3 follows in a passage that opens and closes with a description of Jesus's commandment: 'Love one another, as I have loved you'. Jesus tells his disciples of the greatness of his love for them—he lays down his life for them, as they are now his friends. They are dear to him because he has chosen them to be his own. Chosen to live within this communion of love, the believer lives a fruitful life, and receives whatever she or he asks of the Father.

The Word

Sunday 9 May 2021: Sixth Sunday of Easter

First Reading

From the Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26. 34-35. 44-48

The gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out upon the gentiles also.

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated himself. But Peter helped him up. 'Stand up,' he said, 'I am only a man after all!' Then Peter addressed them: 'The truth I have now come to realise' he said, 'is that God does not have favourites, but that anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him.'

While Peter was still speaking the Holy Spirit came down on all the listeners. Jewish believers who had accompanied Peter were all astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on the pagans too, since they could hear them speaking strange languages and proclaiming the greatness of God. Peter himself then said, 'Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to these people, now they have received the Holy Spirit just as much as we have?' He then gave orders for them to be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to stay on for some days.
